MacDonald Gallery opens with three generations of art

An outstanding former Wyoming Valley artist will be honored when The MacDonald Art Gallery at College Misericordia opens its 1993-94 exhibition season with the presentation of "Alice, Gayle and Julia," September 7 through October 3.

The first of 10 scheduled events at the Gallery this year, the exhibit features mixed media art work from three generations of the late Alice Welsh Jenkins and her family. The display includes the works of Jenkins, a prominent Wyoming Valley artist and teacher of art, her daughter, Gayle Mandle and granddaugh-

ter Julia Mandle.

Jenkins served as a Board Member and Chairman of the Fine Arts Fiesta. She also operated Studio 29 where she taught art classes for students of all skill levels.

Her water color and mixed media works were displayed at the College Misericordia Art Gallery in 1980 as a retrospective following her death in 1978.

"Alice Welsh Jenkins opened the world of art to many people, including myself," said Angela Kelly, a former student of Jenkins and curator of this exhibit. "This dis-

play is a special tribute to her and her daughter and granddaughter for their outstanding work in the arts."

The display will also feature the collages of Gayle Mandle, who has operated an interior design business in Washington, D.C. for 23 years. She earned her bachelor of science in art education from Skidmore College and also graduated from the Corcoran School of Art in Washington, D.C.

Also included in the exhibit are the multi-purpose artistic statement works of Julia Mandle. Her works are generally small scale

and many pieces can be worn as jewelry. She graduated from Williams College with a bachelors degree in fine arts.

Exhibits in the MacDonald Art Gallery are free and open to the public year-round. Gallery hours are Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, 12-5 p.m. and 6-8 p.m.; Friday, 12-5 p.m.; Saturday and Sunday, 1-5 p.m. The Gallery is closed Monday.
