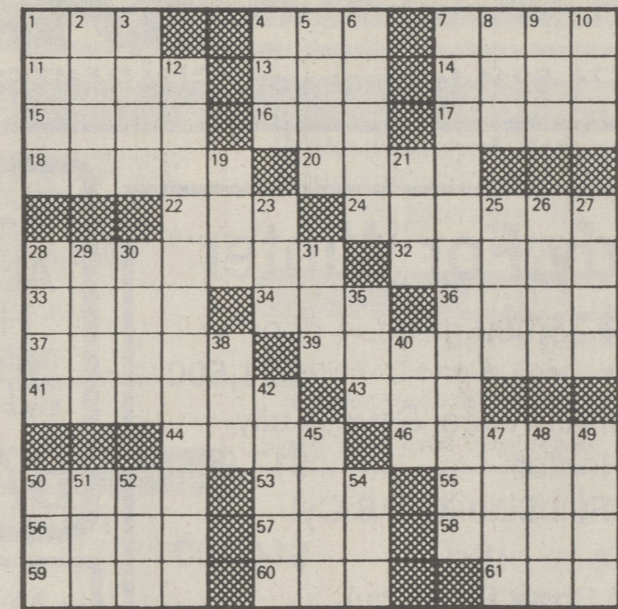
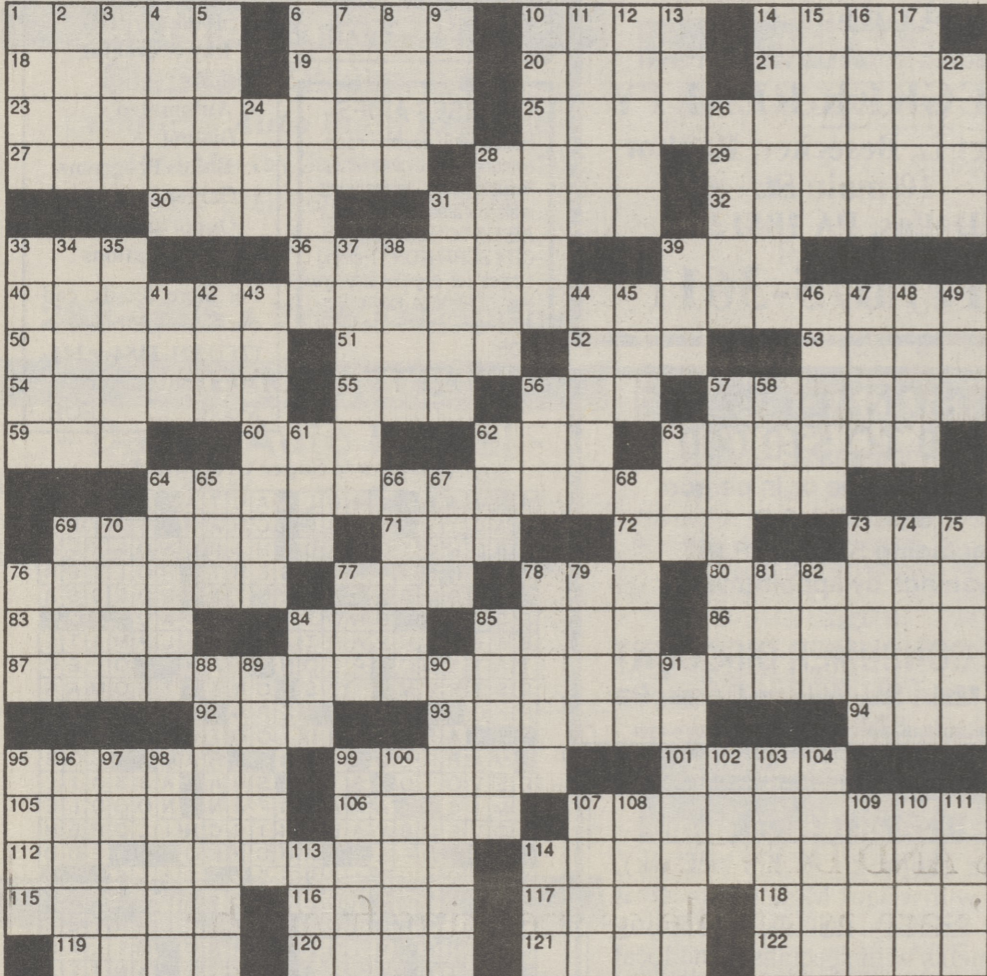

Municipal notes

HARVEYS LAKE BOROUGH

At its regular October 19 meeting, the council voted to:

- Notify residents that the borough is again accepting newsprint for recycling.
- Councilman David Abod noted that newspapers must be placed on top of the co-mingled recyclables in the covered recycling container provided by the borough. Although the borough pays \$19 per ton to recycle newsprint and \$25 per ton to recycle co-mingled materials, Abod said that the hauler, Wayne-Pike Sanitation, pays the borough \$62.50 per ton of all recyclables, while the Department of Environmental Resources (DER) pays an additional \$5 per ton.
- The borough presently recycles two tons per week, Abod said.
- Accepted a county grant of up to \$10,000 to demolish approximately 14 dilapidated homes in the borough.
- Award a \$3,380 bid to K&G Construction to demolish a dilapidated home on Carpenter Road under the county demolition grant.
- Accept a non-exclusive contract with Tele-Media for cable service to the borough for the next five years, with the contract renewable for an additional three years. The borough will receive three percent of revenues from basic and premium service, installation fees and rental of converter boxes.

Because the contract is non-exclusive, other cable companies may also bid on service in the borough, council noted.

- Approve the Angicola, Hoover and Burak subdivisions.
- Donate \$100 to the United Way.

In response to a question from George Andrews, council said that the borough has paid attorney Ralph Kates \$6,600 so far to represent the borough in a pending federal legal action filed by former zoning officer Dan Samson.

The borough isn't covered by liability insurance for this type of case, according to solicitor Charles McCormick.

"The borough has filed a motion to dismiss the charges because the allegations of punitive damages and damage to his reputation are too general. We are confident that it will be decided in our favor," McCormick said.
