

Leaf pickup schedules

Back Mountain communities have announced schedules for picking up bagged leaves:

Kingston Township: Bagged leaves left at curbside will be picked up Nov. 22-Dec. 3, between 7 a.m. and 3 p.m. Monday through Friday. Do not sweep loose leaves into gutters or roadways. Permits are required to burn leaves.

This is a change; information originally given to The Post listed the dates as October 26-Nov. 6.

Dallas Township: Bagged leaf pickup will be Nov. 15-19. Bagged leaves also may be brought to the rear of the township building at any time.

Dallas Borough: Leaves left in bags at curbside will be picked up as road crews see them. Do not sweep loose leaves into gutters or roadways.

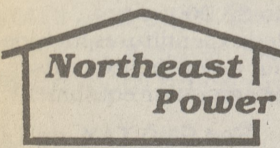
