

Four alumni honored by Wyoming Seminary

Wyoming Seminary's highest honor—the Distinguished Service Award, was presented to four members of the school community on Friday, Oct. 15. Dr. Mary Berninger Allan of Westtown, Ridgway Espy of McLean, Va., Walter Morgan of Bryn Mawr, and Charles Parente of Harveys Lake were honored at the annual recognition dinner held by the school's board of trustees.

Parente is president and chief executive officer of C-TEC Corporation, a diversified telecommunications business headquartered in Wilkes-Barre. He served as a member of the Wyoming Seminary Board of Trustees from 1976 to 1992. A cum laude graduate of King's College with a bachelor of science degree, Parente joined C-TEC after a distinguished career in accounting; first with Deloitte, Haskins and Sells, and later as the managing partner and chief executive officer of Parente, Randolph, Orlando, Carey and Associates of Wilkes-Barre, the largest accounting firm in Pennsylvania.

Former general campaign chairman for the United Way of Wyoming Valley, he serves as chairman of the board of directors at King's College, and also serves on the boards of St. Joseph's Hospital Center Foundation in Scranton and the Wyoming Valley Health Care System, Inc. His four children are Wyoming Seminary graduates.

Allan, a 1947 graduate of Wyoming Seminary, is a native of

After receiving her medical degree from the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine, she completed her internship, residency and a post-doctoral fellowship in cardiology at the Philadelphia General Hospital. Twenty-three years after she received her M.D., she received her law degree from Temple University Law School.

A past president of the Chester County Medical Society, she is a Fellow of the American College of Cardiology and a member of the Pennsylvania Bar Association. A Wyoming Seminary trustee from 1989 to 1992, she has served as class agent for her class, and served on the school's presidential search committee.

Espy, a Kingston native, graduated from Wyoming Seminary in 1939. He holds a bachelor's degree from Wesleyan University, where he was named to Phi Beta Kappa. Espy served as a Wyoming Seminary trustee from 1979 to 1982, and has been an enthusiastic and dedicated advocate for Wyoming Seminary.

A native of Wilkes-Barre, Morgan graduated from the city's Harry Hillman Academy in 1916 and from Princeton University in 1920. After an early career with the accounting firm of Haskins and Sells, he organized and founded one of the nation's first balanced funds - the Wellington Fund in 1928.

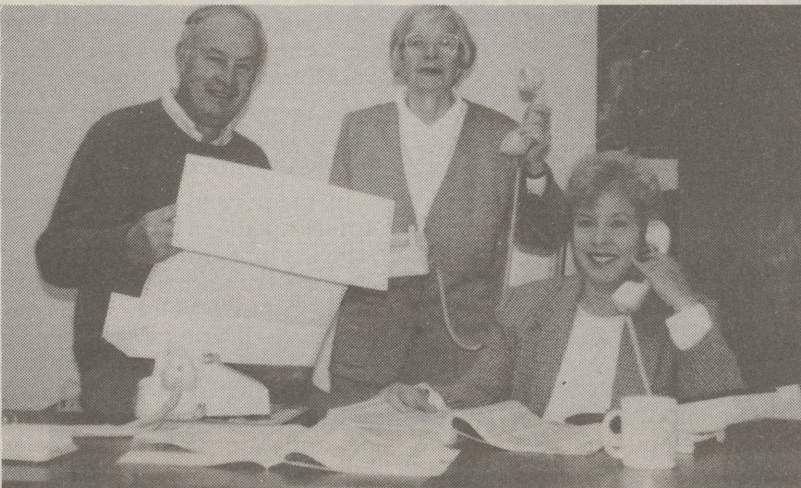
