New area choral ensemble to debut

A new choral ensemble will present its Wyoming Valley premiere on November 18 in a benefit performance for the Wyoming Valley Council of Churches.

Amici Cantus, under the direction of John Michael Vaida, is a 16-voice ensemble composed of choral musicians from Scranton to Hazleton. The premiere concert, which is scheduled for 8 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 18 in St. Nicholas Roman Catholic Church, South Washington Street, Wilkes-Barre, is titled "A Musical Feast," and features choral works from the past five centuries.

"With the development of this group, we are developing a choral presence in the area that is modeled after European choral groups," noted Vaida, director of the fine arts program at Wyoming Seminary in Kingston. "Amici Cantus" means 'friendly singers' in Italian, and it's a pleasure to work with this group of trained musicians who are joining together for the love of music.

Vaida, who has taught at Wyoming Seminary since 1977, is an internationaly known choral adjudicator, clinician and conductor.

Tickets for the November 18 performance are \$5, and are available in advance or at the door.
