The Folklore Society of Northeast Pennsylvania and the Chicory House of Wilkes-Barre will hold their monthly New England Contra Dance Saturday, Nov. 13 from 7 to 10:30 p.m. in Fellowship Hall of the First Presbyterian Church, 97 South Franklin Street at Northampton Street in Downtown Wilkes-Barre. Singles, couples, beginners, young and old are all welcome. A review of basic figures will be held from 7 to 7:30 and all dances will be taught throughout the evening. Dancers should wear soft-soled shoes and casual dress.

Presiding will be the caller and musician team John Kirk and Trish Miller, a husband and wife duo from Guildford, New York. Dances will include contras, circle sets, squares, mixers and couple dances. Music will include lively fiddle tunes, old country waltzes and contra dance music in the New England tradition. John plays the fiddle. Trish plays banjo and guitar, and it's likely they'll be joined by some friends to round out the band.

John, a Hudson Valley native,

is known in the folk world as a vocalist, a multi-instrumentalist and a composer. A dance caller since 1977, he can call dances and play fiddle simultaneously! Trish is originally from Virginia, where she started calling dances in 1979. She's toured extensively as a member of the Green Grass Cloggers. Both Trish and John are accomplished cloggers and include some fancy Southern stepping in all their programs.
