Mundy said the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program was cut again this year by the federal government, with the program experiencing a 28 percent funding drop over the last six

"Last year, the need for LIHEAP money outran the supply of dollars. Many eligible families could not get assistance because Pennsylvania's allocation had run out,"

said Mundy. Based on the availability of funds, the LIHEAP cash grant program will run from Dec. 6 to Jan. 13 and the crisis program will operate from Jan. 14 to March 15. In other years, the program operated from November to April.

Income eligibility for both programs has been reduced from 150 percent of the federal poverty level to 135 percent. for a family of four, this means the previous maximum income of \$20,925 has declined to \$19,373.

Households only will be able to apply for a crisis grant if bills are \$350 in arrears, compared to \$200 last year. And individual crisis grants, paid to keep the utilities from being cut off, will be capped at \$250 instead of \$300.
