Misericordia adds religious law institute

College Misericordia recently established the Institute of Law and Religious Life, announced Dr. Carol A. Jobe, Misericordia president.

The new Institute will provide educational and professional development for women in leadership positions in Roman Catholic religious congregations, specifically in areas related to corporate, civil and canon law. The Institute also will provide consultation services to individual congregations.

Cecilia Meighan, RSM, Ed.D., J.D., the Institute's executive

director, said the idea for the Institute grew out of College Misericordia's earlier experience in conducting the Canon Law Institute for more than 20 years, pre- and post-Vatican II.

"The Institute has been established to serve as a resource to those individuals who are elected or appointed to leadership of Roman Catholic congregations of women," she said. "The new Institute will emphasize hands-on experience that will provide the information and tools that leaders of religious congregations need to carry out their canonical and

legal responsibilities."

Meighan noted many congregations are dealing with such issues as: sponsorship of schools, hospitals and social service agencies; legal requirements of state and federal agencies; employment practices; and tax questions.

The Institute's initial program, "The Religious Institute and Its Corporate Structures," will be held June 23-29, 1994 at College Misericordia. Nationally recognized experts in the field of canon and civil law will lead sessions on a variety of related topics.
