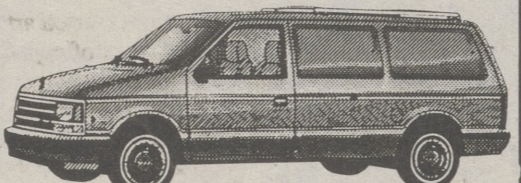

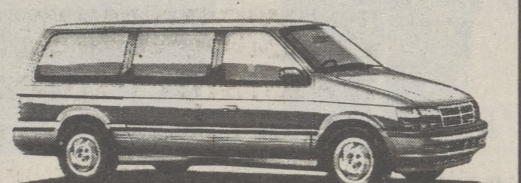

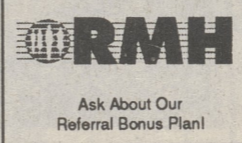

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Jackson Township Supervisors at their regular meeting to be held on February 7, 1994 at 7:30 o'clock, P.M. at the Jackson Township Municipal Building, 2211 Huntsville Road, Shavertown, Jackson Township, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania; will pass an Ordinance that sets forth uniform requirements for direct and indirect contributors into the waste water collection and treatment system of Jackson Township and enables Jackson Township to comply with all applicable state and federal laws as required by the Clean Water Act of 1977 and the General Pretreatment Regulations (Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 403), and the rules and regulations of the Wyoming Valley Sanitary Authority (WVSA), a publicly owned treatment works with which Jackson Township has a service agreement for collection and treatment of waste water flowing from the sanitary sewer system of the said Jackson Township; that the purpose of the said Ordinance is to prevent the introduction of pollutants into the waste water system which will interfere with operation of the system, contaminate the resulting sludge, or be difficult to treat by conventional means; also to prevent the introduction of pollutants into the waste water system which will pass through the system inadequately treated into receiving streams of the atmosphere or otherwise be incompatible with the system, also to improve the opportunity to recycle and reclaim waste water and sludges from the system; also to provide for equitable distribution of costs of the municipal waste water system; also to provide for penalties and costs for the willful and/or negligent violation of the provisions of this Ordinance or the falsifying of information required by the Ordinance. The Ordinance will provide for the regulation of direct and indirect contributors to the municipal waste water system through the issuance of permits to certain non-domestic users and through enforcement of general requirements for all users, and authorizes monitoring enforcement activities and requires user reporting assures that existing customers' capacity will not be pre-empted and provides for the setting of fees for the equitable distribution of costs resulting from the program established herein. The Ordinance applies to Jackson Township and to persons outside Jackson Township who are by contract or agreement with Jackson Township users of the said municipality and/or the Wyoming Valley Sanitary Authority except as otherwise provided in the Ordinance. The Executive Director of the Wyoming Valley Sanitary Authority shall administer, implement and enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.
