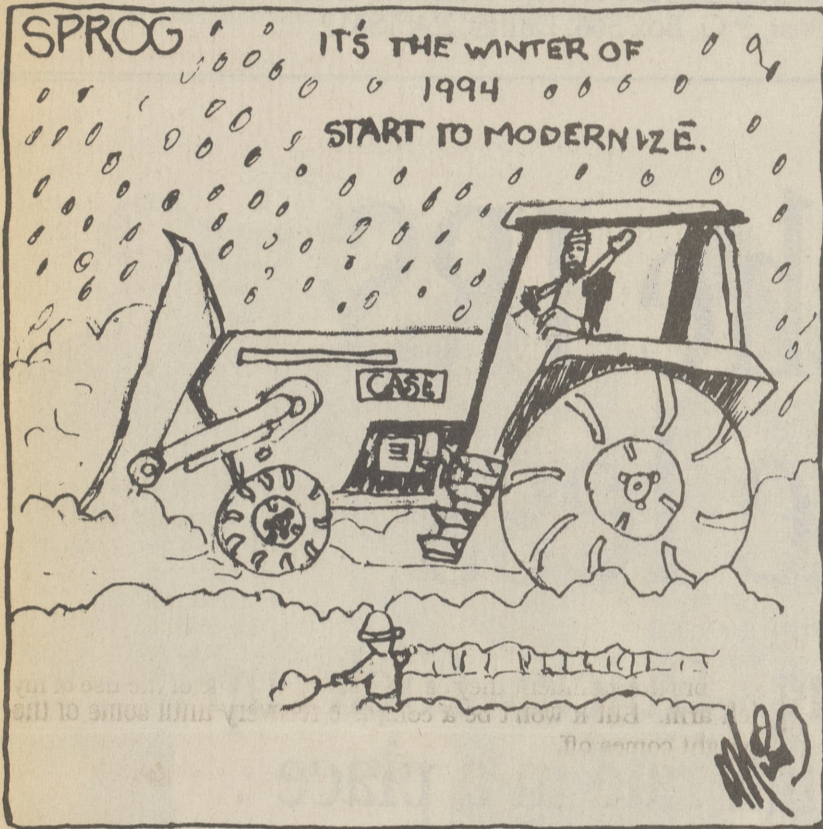
The awards are granted to students who combine outstanding performance on a competitive examination, with high qualities

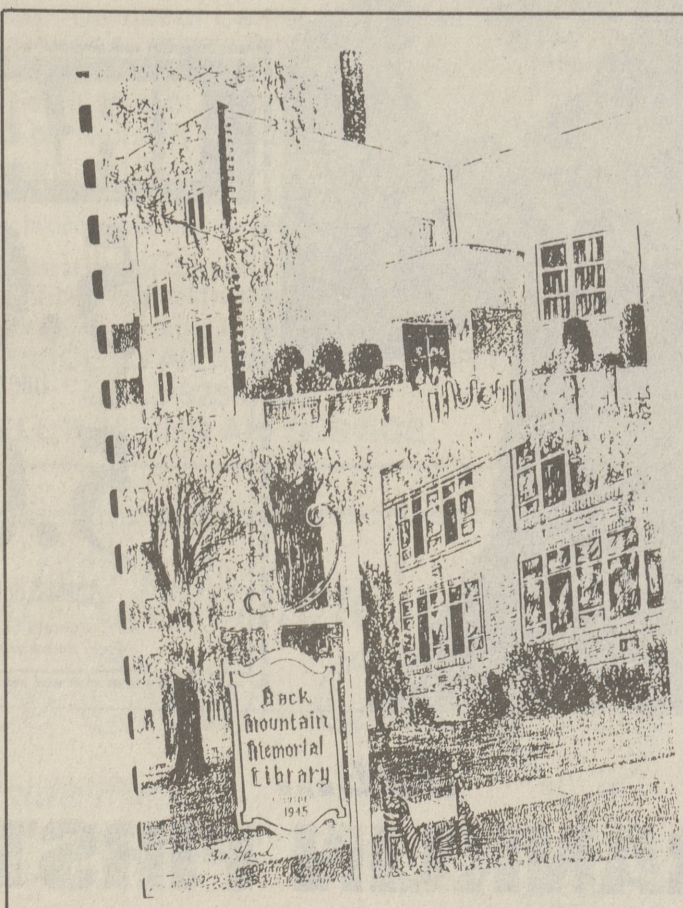
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
