Robert N. Gawlas, Jr. is a partner in the law firm of Rosenn, Jenkins and Greenwald and has

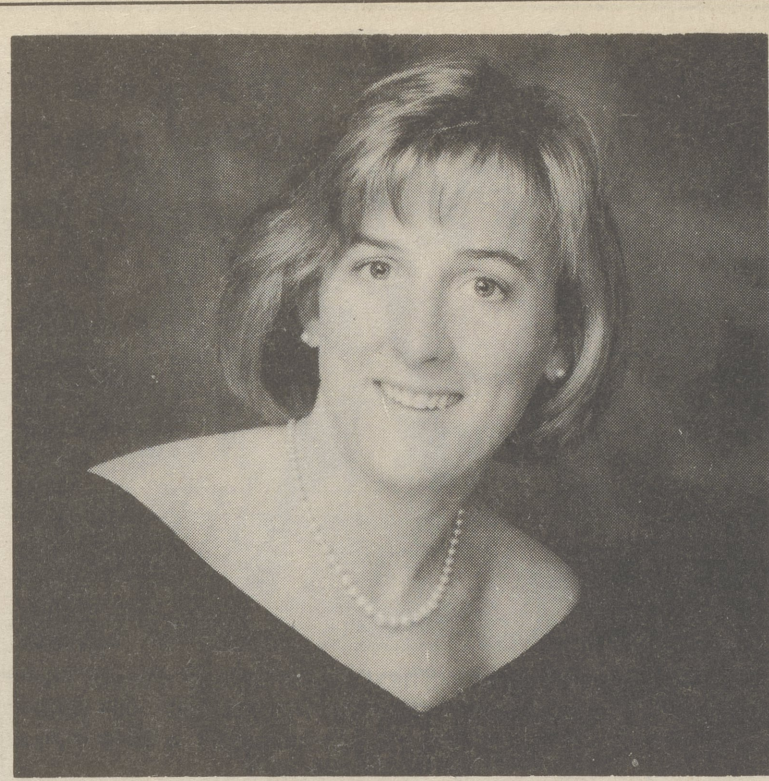
been a member of the firm's Litigation Department since 1986.

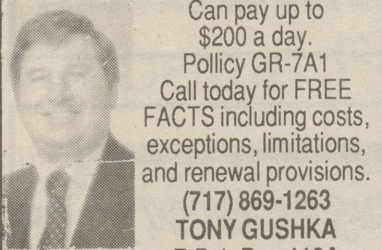
The program began January 29. Admission is free for youth members or \$3 at the door.
