# Time to apply for PA, federal financial aid programs

The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency (PHEAA) has streamlined its application process for state and federal higher education grants, according to Sen. Charles D. Lemmond (R-20).

Lemmond said that students and families now only have to fill out one form. (The Free Application for Federal Student Aid -FAFSA) to be eligible for both state and federal assistance. Previously, applicants were required to file both a federal and state application for financial aid.

The deadline for all applicants who are seeking to renew grants for the 1994-95 academic year is May 1, 1994, Lemmond noted. He said this deadline also applies to first-time applicants who plan to enroll in baccalaureate programs, as well as those enrolled in college transfer programs at community or junior colleges.

Students who did not receive a state grant during 1993-94 and who plan to enroll in business, trade, and technical schools; hospital schools of nursing; or two-year, non-transferable college programs, have until August 1, 1994 to apply for aid, Lemmond said.

Although these are the final deadlines, Lemmond stressed that students should submit applications as soon as possible to meet early school and college deadlines for campus-based and institutional aid.


