#### Health insurance advice for senior citizens is available

Older Pennsylvanians confused about the types and amounts of health insurance they might need to supplement Medicare coverage can get help through a new state program called APPRISE, according to Sen. Charles D. Lemmond

The program, developed by the state Department of Aging, offers free counseling through the statewide network of 52 local Area Agencies on Aging.

Because of changes in Medicare and the various supplements that are available, some senior citizens might wonder if they have adequate coverage or whether they're paying for insurance they don't need. The APPRISE program can help sort out the answers to these questions.

People over 65 are the largest

group of long-term health care consumers. Because Medicare does not cover all medical services, it is important that senior citizens be knowledgeable about supplemental coverage.

APPRISE counselors can help seniors understand the differences in health insurance policies, while guiding persons through the Medicare forms and paperwork.

Volunteer counselors will be available at the Area Agencies on Aging offices, senior citizen centers, and other appropriate local sites. Persons interested in utilizing the services offered through the program should contact their local Area Agency on Aging, listed in the Blue pages of the phone?
