The Wilkes-Barre YMCA will be offering a Womens Circuit Weight Training Program.

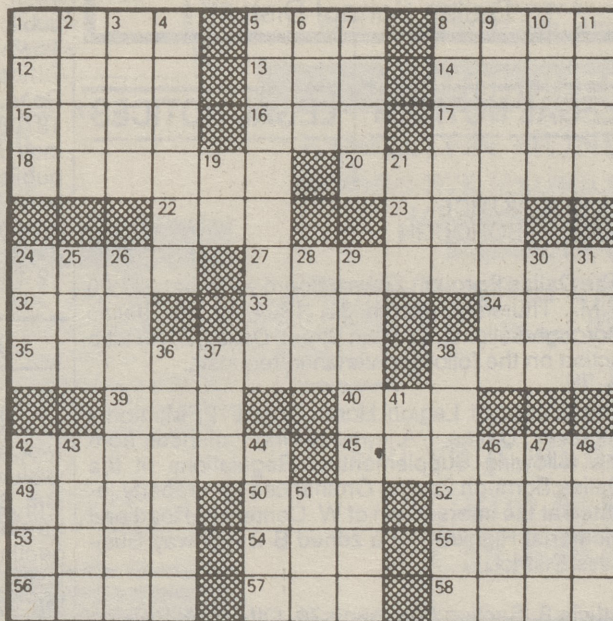
The course is developed to tighten and tone muscle and to enhance strength through the use of free weights and weight machines, with special attention to proper weight training methods designed especially for women.

Included in the eight session program will also be discussions on nutrition and weight management.

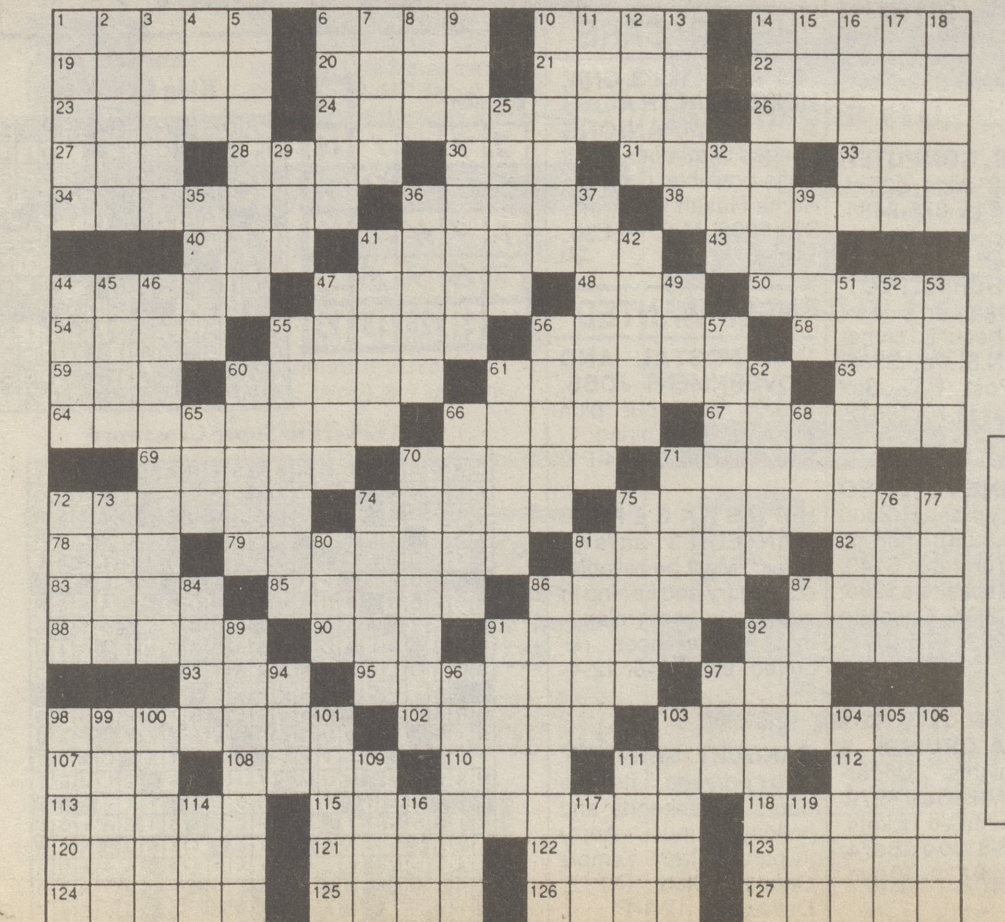
