

Pennsylvania Corps seeks area youth for paid training

The Pennsylvania Corps, a statewide campaign to recruit young Pennsylvanians for community service projects, has begun.

The campaign, operated by PennSERVE, the Governor's Office of Citizen Service, and L&L's Bureau of Employment Security and Training, will seek young men and women, generally ages 14 to 25, to participate in community service programs teaching educational, job and life skills.

The campaign will include public service announcements on the state Public Television network, brochures, posters and other materials.

The campaign is now recruiting for the Summer Youth Service Corps, which this year will employ up to 8,000 young people working in teams on community service projects.

The campaign will emphasize the role of Corps members as "everyday heroes" for doing needed

public service projects.

Participants will have the opportunity to serve in one of seven youth programs, or brigades, administered by the state Department of Labor and Industry: The Pennsylvania Conservation Corps, Summer Youth Service Corps and related summer programs, Pennsylvania Service Corps, Pennsylvania Literacy Corps, Pennsylvania Library Corps, school-based service corps, and local conservation and urban corps.

Most corps programs pay at least the minimum wage and some pay higher. Preference for many programs is given to disadvantaged youths.

The American Legion Home Post 672, Memorial Highway, Dallas, PA is requesting variances from the following Supplementary Regulations of the Dallas Borough Zoning Ordinances for property located at the intersection of W. Center Hill Road and Memorial Highway, in a zoned B-2 Highway Business District.

Article 8, Section 801, page 70, Off-Street Parking and Loading, #6, which states each parking space shall have an area of not less than two hundred (200) square feet and have dimensions of ten (10) feet in width and twenty (20) in depth, exclusive of access drives or aisles. A area of nine (9) feet in width and eighteen (18) feet in depth for each parking space is requested, and Section 801-3, Parking for Business Uses.

Article 8, Section 801, page 74, Parking for Business Uses, #3, which states Eating and drinking establishments, social halls, clubs, including country clubs, lodges and other places serving food and beverages shall be provided with one (1) parking space for every two and one-half (2 1/2) seats for patron use and one (1) space for each employee. A variance is requested from one hundred (100) patron parking spaces and four (4) employee parking spaces to a total of seventy five (75) parking spaces with an area of one hundred sixty-two (162) square feet each.
