NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Lake Township Board of Supervisors, at a regular meeting to be held on April 9, 1994, at 9:00 o'clock a.m., shall take under advisement and move to approve the passage of an ordinance establishing a Snow and Ice and Off-Street Parking Ordinance for Lake Township. A brief summary of the Ordinance to be considered and passed on is as follows:

- Section I provides for the name of the Ordinance.
- Section II prohibits residents from depositing snow on the travel portion of municipal roads and ways.
- Section III prohibits parking on municipal roads and ways.
- Section IV provides for the removal at the owner's expense of vehicles obstructing snow removal and plowing operations on municipal roads and ways.
- Section V provides for enforcement and fines.
- Section VI and VII provides for repeal and severability of clauses; and,
- Section VIII provides for effective date of Ordinance.
