# PUC will hold hearings on water rate increase April 6

The Public Utility Commission has rescheduled a hearing for April 6 at the Lake-Lehman High School to receive public comment on the request of National Utilities, Inc. for a \$261,300 annual increase in water rates.

Administrative Law Judge George M. Kashi will hold the sessions at 7 p.m. in the audito-

The hearing had been originally scheduled for March 9 but cancelled because of bad weather.

Customer testimony will become part of the record on which the commission will base its decision in the case.

The increase would affect customers of the Rhodes Terrace, Midway Manor and Warden Place companies.

Yearly residential bills for 60,000 gallons of water would increase to \$379 for Rhodes Terrace customers and \$266 for Midway Manor and Warden Place



# State kids' health plan has new low income guidelines

The change in eligibility guide-lines for the BlueCHIP (Children's Health Insurance Program) of Pennsylvania program announced recently by Governor Robert Casey will allow Pennsylvania's four Caring Foundations to insure thousands of uninsured children.

The four Caring Foundations, affiliated with the Blue Cross and Blue Shield Plans in Pennsylvania, administer the program as BlueCHIP in different regions throughout the state.

The Children's Health Insurance Program was created by the Governor and Legislature in 1992 and is funded through a designated portion of the cigarette tax.

The Caring Foundations identify, qualify and enroll eligible children and on their behalf purchase insurance coverage from Blue Cross and Blue Shield.

Since May, 1993, the Caring Foundations have received more

than 40,000 applications from children seeking coverage; over 13,000 children who met the state's eligibility guidelines were enrolled. Nearly 1,000 of the total enrolled are children residing in northeastern Pennsylvania.

The change in guidelines will allow children through age 13 with family incomes below 185% of the Federal Poverty Level (e.g., \$27,380 for a family of four) to qualify.

Children must also be a resident of Pennsylvania for more than 30 days and not be covered by private insurance or eligible for Medical Assistance.

The revised guidelines will become effective April 1, 1994.




