Salute to Sen. Lemmond

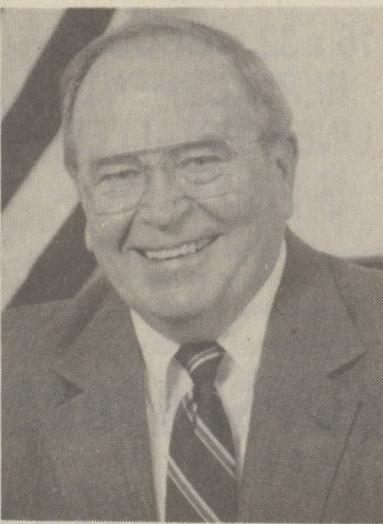
