### L-L Football Club will host spring fashion show April 25





# School district plans to survey education goals

Lake-Lehman superintendent Dr. Nancy Davis announced at the April 5 school board meeting that the district is conducting a survey of educational goals.

Within the next week to ten days, questionnaires will be sent to all 1992 Lake-Lehman graduates, the present junior class, board members, district professional and non-professional staff, members of the strategic planning committee and 1,450 randomly selected district residents, asking each to indicate what they feel students should have learned by the time that they graduate from Lake-Lehman and who should be responsible for teaching them these things.

"Not all of these goals are academics. For example, some respondents may feel that students should learn values and identify the parents or the church as those responsible for teaching them," Dr. Davis said.

Respondents will be asked only to identify themselves as students, parents or teachers - no names will be asked, Dr. Davis said.

"We're using four different forms, so that not everyone gets the same one," she said. "The Circle K Club at Penn State-Lehman will tabulate the results on computer and analyze them
