King's students finish internships

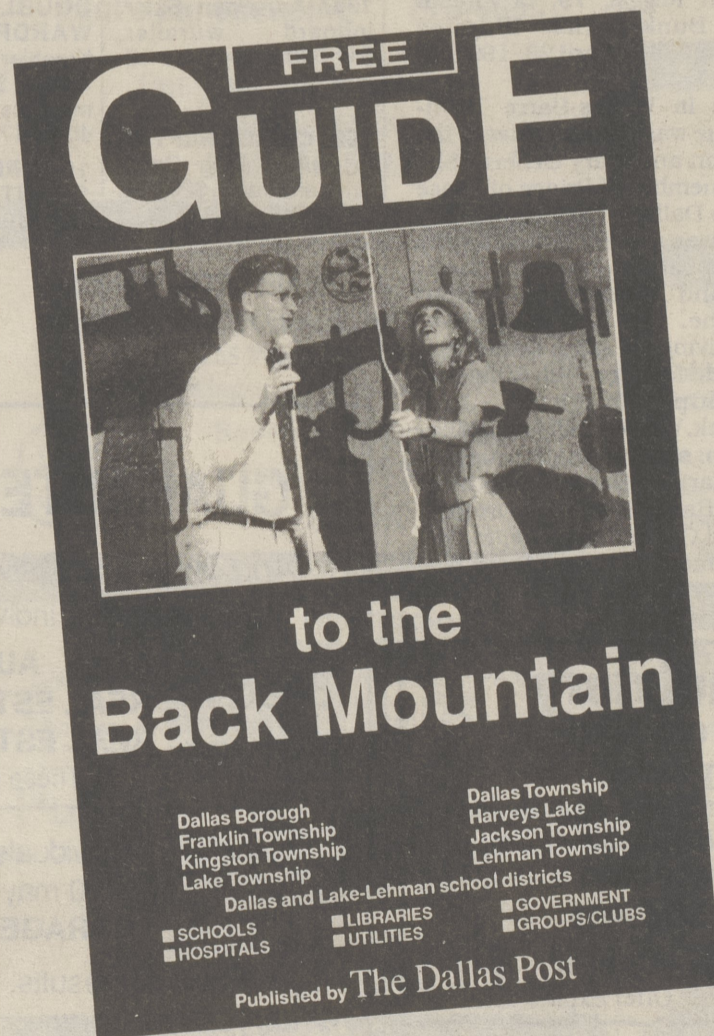

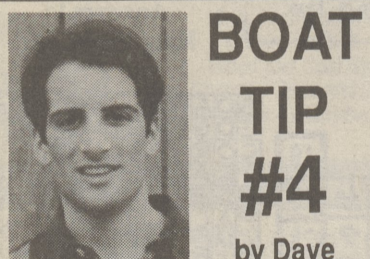
