beaver problem, but it wasn't this Moscow, PA, who has studied the severe," he said. "Now we'll have to take a harder look at the situation."

Last week DER gave borough officials permission to remove the beavers' structures after the Game Commission removes and relocates the beavers.

A live trap set April 15 hadn't nabbed any of the toothy little critters, so the Game Commission planned to try and snare them, according to wildlife conservation officer Jim Jolley.

"We don't believe that there are many beavers left because the holes that we made in their dams last week haven't been completely patched," he said.

"The only problem is that after you get the beavers out, some more may see the vacant territory and try to move in," said council president Martin Noon at the April 20 council meeting.

Harveys Creek is a beaver's gourmet heaven, according to Russell James of EcoScience in

The creek is extensively overgrown with swamp loosestrife (water willow), one of the little critters' favorite foods, James said.

Swamp loosestrife is a shrub, growing about four feet tall, with deep roots called rhizomes, which are extremely difficult to get rid of, James said.

Once the beavers, dams and lodges have been removed, DER and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will evaluate the creek's need for a stream improvement project to control further flooding or ero-

Stream improvement projects costing more that \$100,000 need special legislative approval, Solano

Before the stream improvement project can begin, the Harveys Lake Borough Council must write DER a letter describing the situation and requesting that DER evaluate Harveys Creek.




