

Haddonfield Hills to get water tower

Haddonfield Hills in Dallas Township will acquire a new look by August, when General Waterworks replaces the existing water tank with a new one the size of a 10-story building.

Comparable in size to the water tank at the Dallas High School, the new tank will hold 284,000 gallons of water and will cost an estimated \$160,000, according to general manager Mike Coyle.

"We can't repair the original tank, which held 82,000 gallons," he said. "It leaked and didn't store enough water for the residents' needs - during times of high demand they experienced occasional outages."

The new tank will now make it possible for General Waterworks to correct a water pressure problem and install fire hydrants in Haddonfield Hills, Coyle said.

He expects the new tank to be in service sometime in August.

General Waterworks plans to paint the water tank a light color to blend in with the scenery and to plant trees around its base.

ties in three adjoining counties.

Wyoming County's 911 system overlaps into Franklin Township in Luzerne County, where it serves homes with telephones on the 333 and 388 exchanges.

"The area can't be divided by addresses because the post office has already carved it up into a sometimes confusing set of rural routes.

- At least two fire companies, Kunkle and Franklin-Northmoreland, cover municipalities in both Luzerne and Wyoming counties.

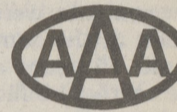
- The state police, who service several smaller area municipalities which can't afford their own departments, won't participate in the county's 911 system because they don't want the equipment.
