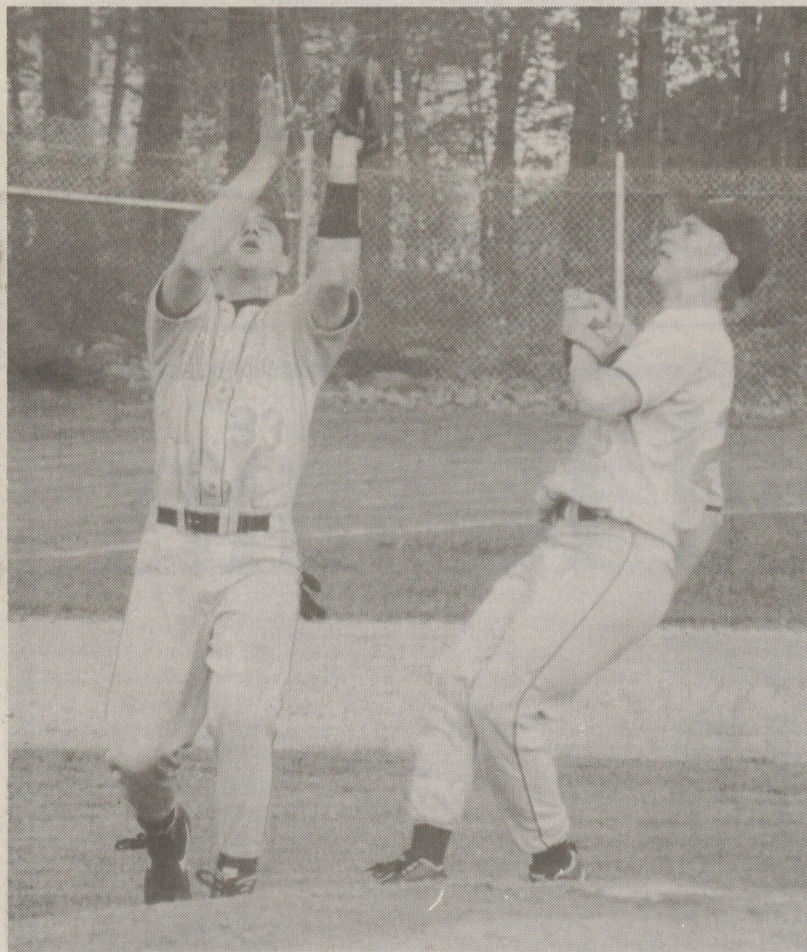

consecutive loss in the game, and are now tied for second place with Tunkhannock in the AAA division.

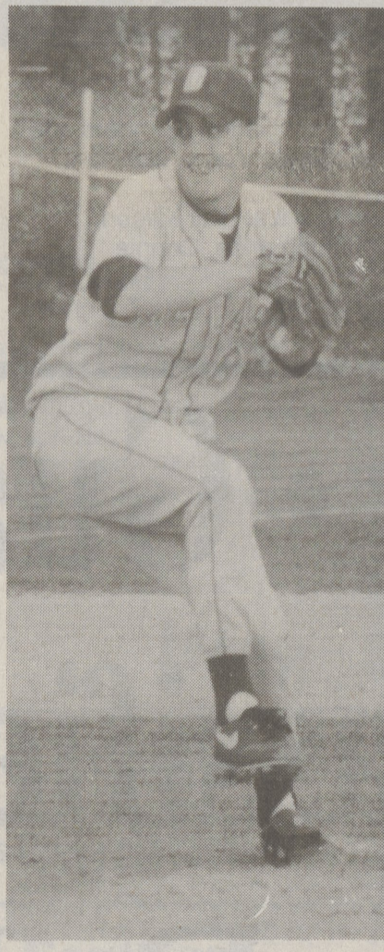

It came down to the last relay as Crestwood won the overall championship by just two points 48-46 over Lehman.

Coach Ed Radzinski's Lady Black Knights captured 20 medals and set five new school records, including a new meet record in the 4x200 meter relay.

The team of Sara Kasper, Marie Manzoni, Niki Yoblonski and Jen Marchakitis captured the gold and the record with a time of 1:58.9, breaking the old record by a full second.

They also earned the gold medal in the 4x100 relay, with a time of 55.06 another new school record.

In the 4x800 meter relay another school record was broken. The team of Sara Kasper, Niki
