

Dallas school registration still open for all students

The Dallas School District is requesting the cooperation of parents of children of school age who have not registered for the 1994-95 school year.

It is essential the district knows as soon as possible of all new students planning to register, especially the Kindergarten and first grade students.

Problems occur with class and school building assignments and transportation arrangements when students are registered late.

Parents of new students or those transferring from other schools are strongly encouraged to register their children immediately.

Late elementary registrants

may not be assigned to the most convenient school building.

All Kindergarten through 5th grade students are to register at the Administration Building, Church Street, Dallas.

Middle and Senior High students will register at their respective schools on Conyngham Ave., Dallas Township.

Parents must bring birth certificates, report cards from the previous school and immunization records.

No student will be allowed to enter school without proof of required immunizations.

Kingston Township Tax Collector, Janice Castellani reminds residents that face value on 1994 county tax bills will end Friday, June 10.

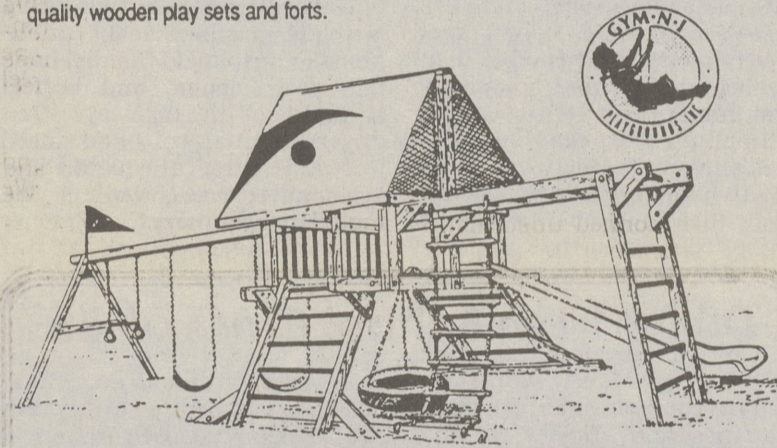
Taxes will be due at penalty value after that date.

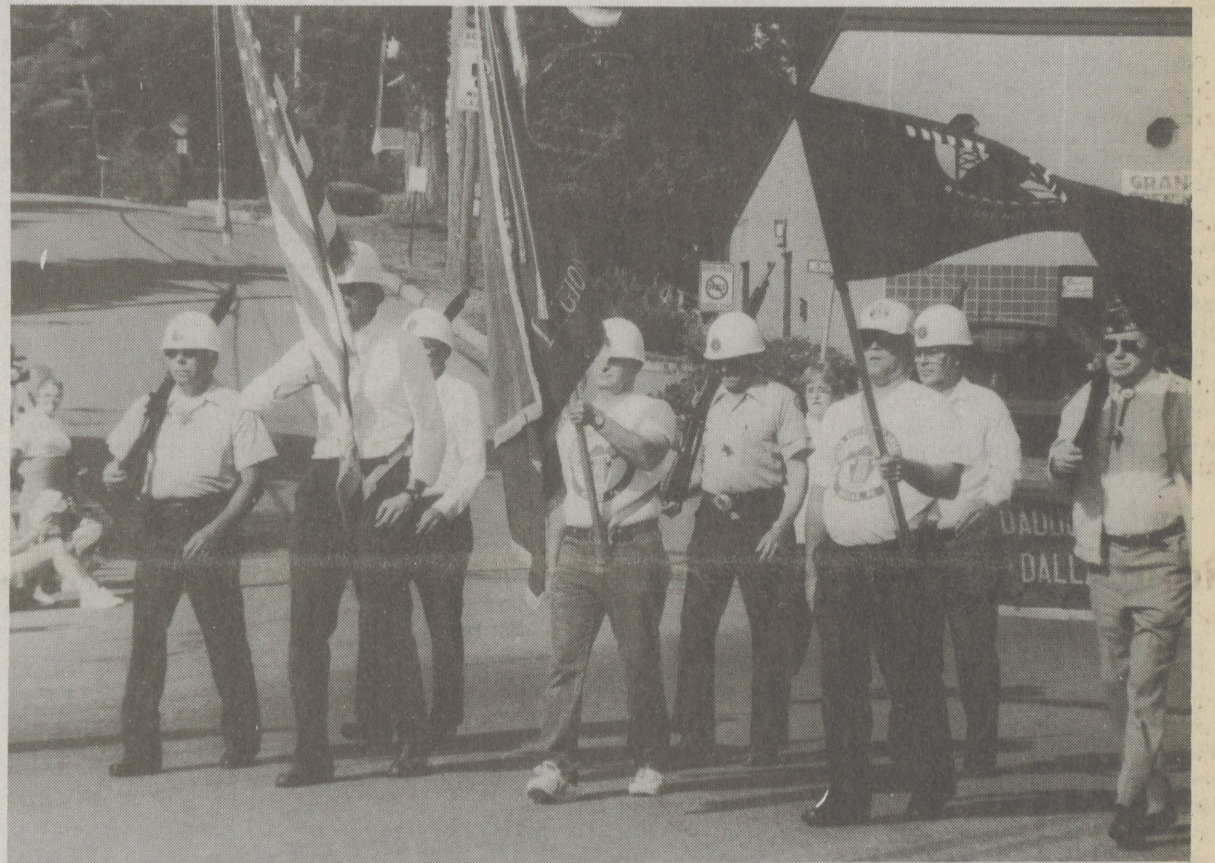
