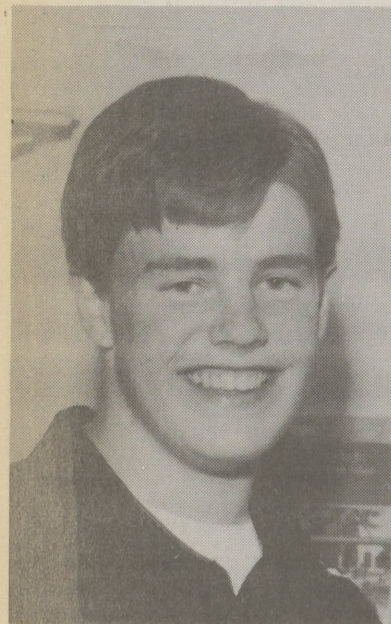

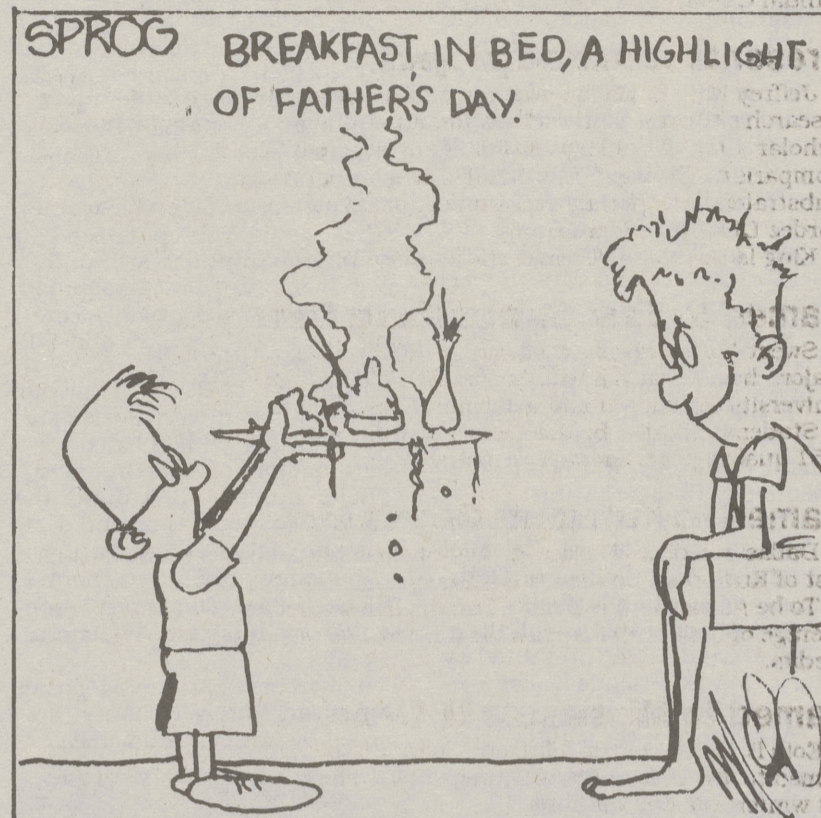

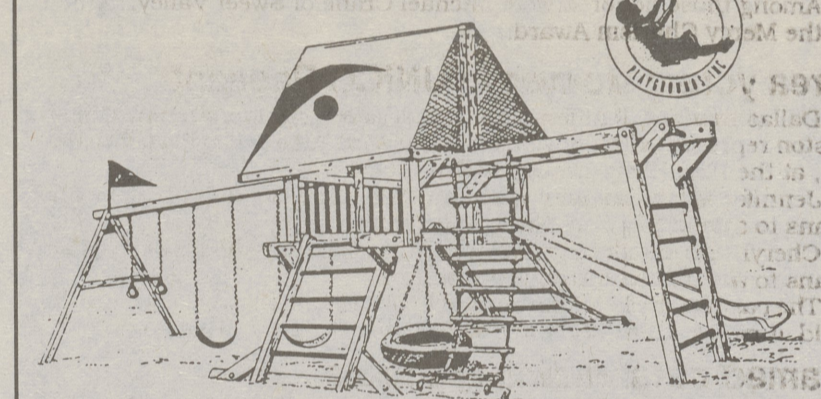
The students attended weekly academic classes and workshops on career and self-development, the summer residential program, educational trips, and leadership activities.


