"I'm sure that he will be at a loss after we are gone," she joked.

Remembering her teachers' words of praise and encouragement, Turner said that they helped keep everything in focus.

On behalf of her class, she thanked the teachers, administrators, families and friends for their help and encouragement.

But when it came his class's turn for these special senior activities, Lucarino said that he found himself "hanging onto every last second, being unsure of the future, holding onto the memories of the past."

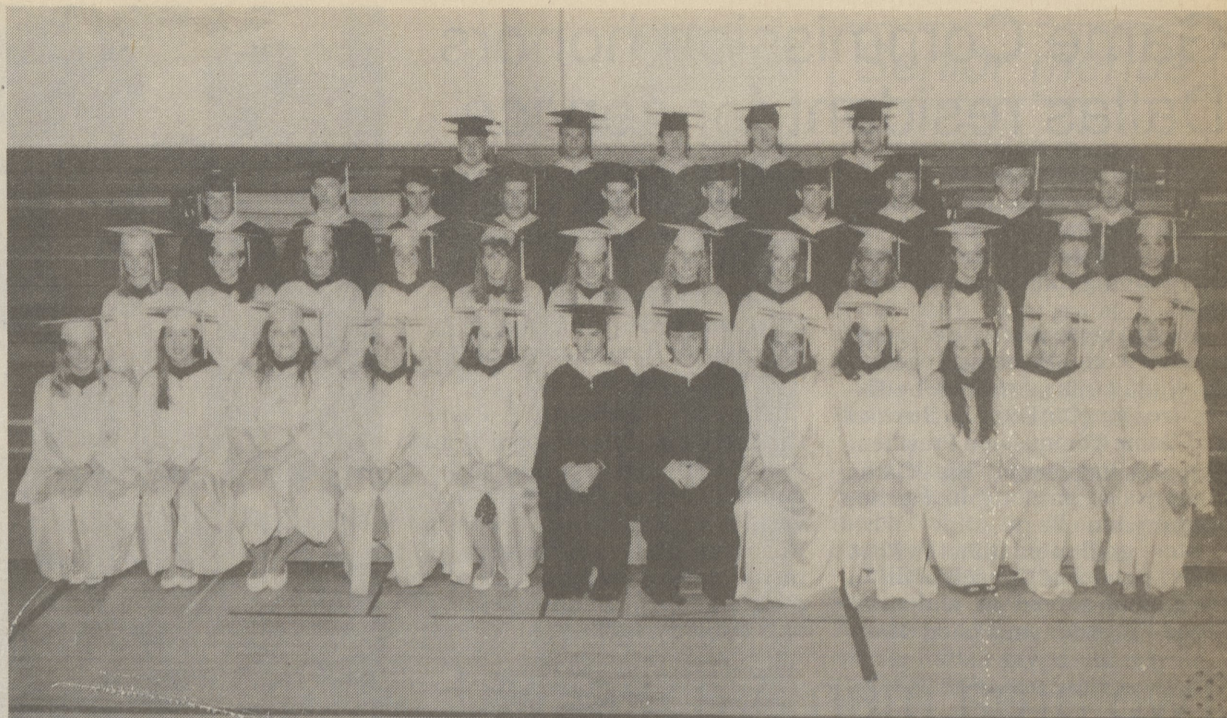
He credited the small size of his class with giving him the opportunity to learn respect, tolerance and acceptance of those different from himself.

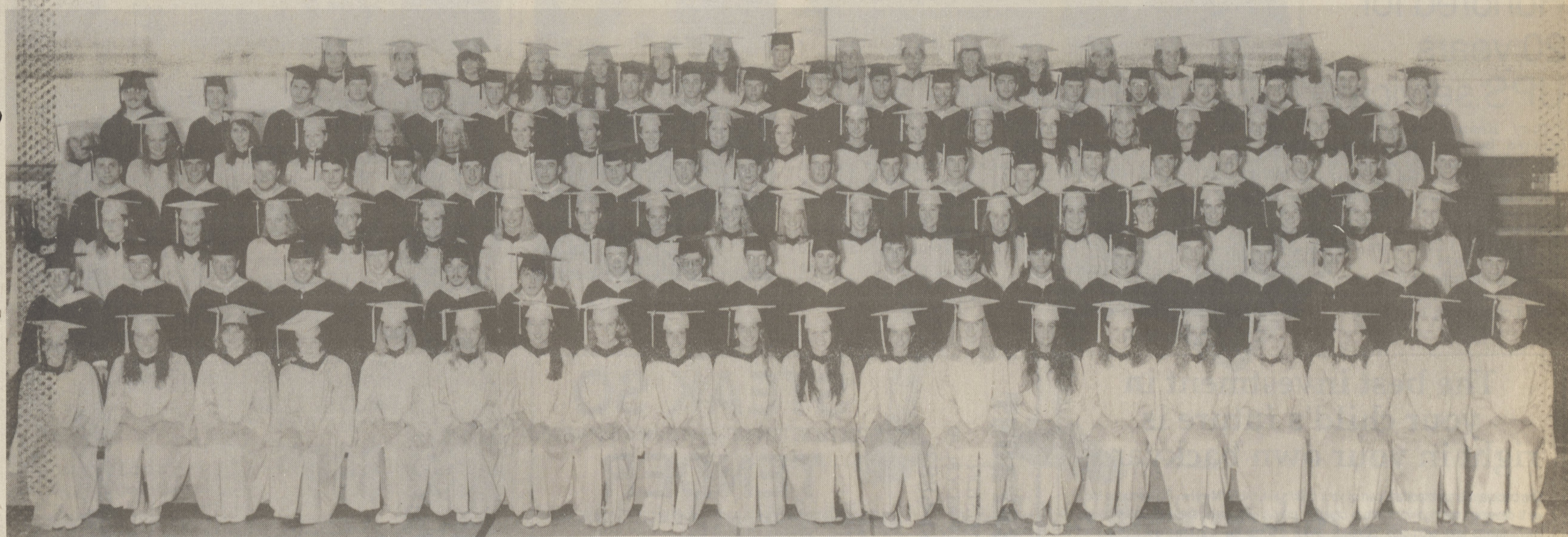
