The MacDonald Art Gallery at College Misericordia will present "A Parade of Parasols and Umbrellas," a diversified collection of parasols and umbrellas, July 1 to July 31. The exhibit is free and open to the public.

More than 50 parasols and umbrellas are included in this exhibit, which is accompanied by text panels that explain the varied uses to which parasols and um-

brellas have been put during their 3,000 year history.

The collection features one specimen with a carved Chinese ivory handle with dragons, pheasants, butterflies, bats and flowers. Another, with a grey silk cover mounted to a yellow handle carved with an elephants head, has additional elephants displayed on the spokes.

The rich diversity of styles

represented in this collection serves to demonstrate the importance that has been attached to the parasol and umbrella as an accessory for well-born men and women.

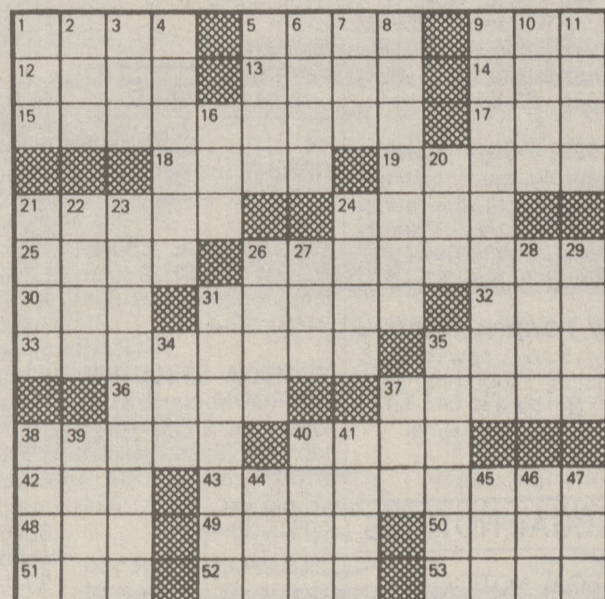
