early intervention and early childhood education," Mrs. Whipple said. "Many of the children in the day care program would be latchkey kids if we didn't have it."

She also respects Dr. Davis's philosophy that every child can learn, no matter what socioeconomic group they come from, and that every child should start kindergarten ready to begin a lifetime of learning.

Jeff Fritzen credited Dr. Davis with a lot of hard work on strategic planning and preparing the district for outcome-based education (O.B.E.).

"The principals and teams will have to work hard to pick up the slack," Fritzen said. "We'll have to delegate someone to finish this work. The board will have to meet very shortly to plan a course of

He added that finding a new superintendent could take three to six months, by the time the position is advertised, applications returned and lengthy interviews conducted.

Starting in late August, Dr. Davis will be the director of teacher extension programs at Wilkes University's education department, according to assistant director of university relations Stephanie Geyer.

Her new job will involve work with area teachers in all grades to pool their knowledge on different learning methods and technologies, and with Project LEARN, in which more than 4,000 area teachers meet in alternate years to share their work on successful teaching
