

Due to move, Chase resigns as Dallas Borough treasurer

Dallas Borough Council accepted the resignation of treasurer Carlton Chase "with deep regret" at its monthly meeting June 21. Mr. Chase said his move was necessary because of job-relocation out of town. Council president Don Cooper presented a farewell gift and council gave Chase a standing ovation.

Borough Manager Milton Lutsey expressed his own "deeply felt personal loss. Chase will be sorely missed by me," he said. "His help and thoughtful guidance have been invaluable to me."

In other personnel matters, John Prichard was appointed Code Enforcement Officer.

Chief of Police John Fowler said he was pleased with the donation of three bulletproof vests from the state Adjutant General's office. Fowler noted, "These first class vests are worth over \$1,000 each and we are fortunate to have them."

William Roberts, Roads Chairman, said the final spring cleanup figure was \$16,305, up from last year because of using more dumpsters and paying for additional security. Milt Lutsey added that this year's cleanup was the best yet. It went smoothly and he

said, "People look forward to it. It's very well-received, a great service that many other communities lack, and we should be very proud that we have it."

Roberts also asked, and received unanimous approval for, a resolution to request that the Luzerne County Commissioners resume the county spraying so that this year's caterpillar and inchworm infestation will not be repeated. "We're in for massive destruction next year if spraying is not accomplished."

Eight building permits were issued in the month since the previous meeting. Permission was granted to Robert Brown to add a \$5,000 rear deck to 132 Jackson St. and Clifford Scheetman to add a covered deck, value \$10,000, to 126 Machell Avenue. Permissions were also granted as follows: Patricia McCue, 35 Redledge Drive, greenhouse added to side of her home, \$8,000; Merriel Oliver, 284 Machell Avenue, addition to home, \$10,000; Joseph Hudak, 111 Moffit St., add deck, \$3,000; and Ray L. Jayne, 27 Davenport St., above-ground pool, \$5,000.

New home permits were issued to Harry and Kim Vivian (\$180,000 value at Lot #51 Deer Meadows) and to Michael and Gail Touey (\$80,000 value at 130 W. Center Hill Road.)

Hearing June 30 on Creative Rooms

The owner of a Harveys Lake business who has denied that he is operating a manufacturing business will have to explain to a judge why he has violated two stop work orders.

Mark Sopp, owner of Creative Rooms on Route 415 at Harveys Lake, will have a hearing June 30 at 10:30 a.m. before District Magistrate James Tupper.

According to borough codes enforcement officer Paul Grimes, the orders were filed against Sopp January 24, 1994, and April 27, 1994, because Sopp is manufacturing in a commercial district, where manufacturing isn't allowed.

Sopp told the Harveys Lake zoning hearing board in November, 1993 that Creative Rooms sells and makes kitchen cabinets and countertops from plywood and formica.

He has contended that he is merely assembling the items, not manufacturing them.

Campground Hill, Edinger Hill roads will be rebuilt

Families living on Campground Hill and Edinger Hill roads in Dallas Township will see some new traffic patterns later this summer when the township rebuilds the two roads.


According to supervisor Phil Walter, Luzerne County recently approved a \$99,000 street improvement grant for the project, which the supervisors hope to bid out in July and be finished before school starts.

"The township's only cost will

be for the engineering study," Walter said. "It's a good way to upgrade the roads at a minimal cost to the township. We couldn't have done the work without the grant."

New drainage pipes and catch basins will be installed and the 6,000-foot stretch of roadway between Upper Demunds Road and Valley View Trailer Park will be repaved.

Walter said that the two roads qualified because they are sparsely populated and the families meet county income guidelines.
