The Lions Eye Bank promotes corneal transplants to cure blindness, collects eye donor pledge cards and collects used eye glasses.

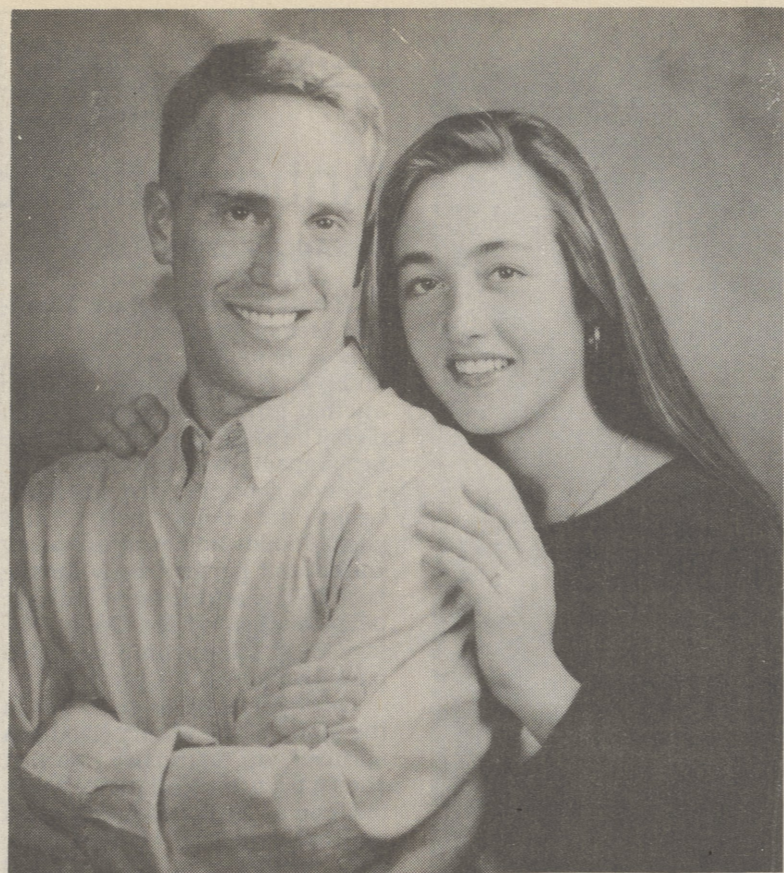


### New Junior Girl Scouts

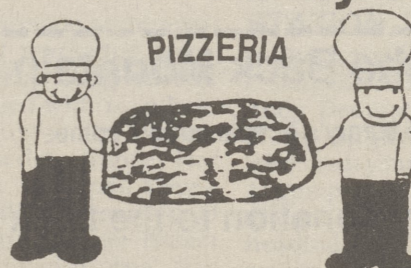

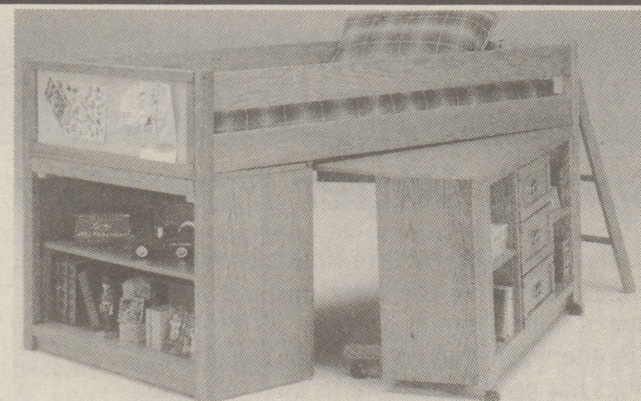

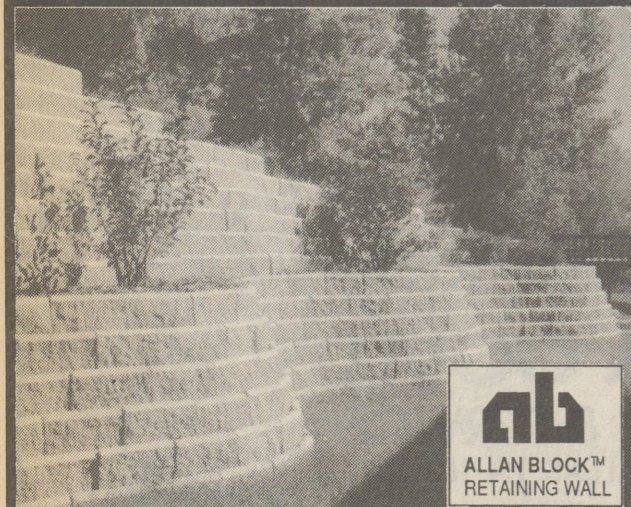
