Little League

Playoff finals Thursday

The Dodgers, Giants and Phillies finished the regular season as tri-champions in the National League while the Rangers won their third consecutive American League championship as Back Mountain Baseball concluded regular season play last weekend.

The Dodgers, under the direction of manager Tom Dougherty and assistant coaches Greg Moyer and Mike Loftus, finished the season with a record of 14-6 as did the Giants under the manager Bob Bayer and assistant coaches Russ Eyet and Ed Whipple. The Phillies also finished the regular season with a mark of 14-6.

The Rangers, with manager Tom Evans and assistant coaches Bob Faneck and Gerry Wycallis, finished the regular season with a record of 17-2. The Harveys Lake Pirates and the Giants were the only teams to beat the Rangers. The Indians finished their second game with the Rangers in a tie and the game was not concluded.

Seedings for the playoffs were as follows (tiebreakers, including head-to-head competition and best divisional record, were used for teams with identical records): National League: 1) Phillies, 2) Giants, 3) Dodgers, 4) Reds. American League: 1) Rangers, 2) Tigers, 3) A's, 4) Red Sox. First round playoff games were played last Sunday with second round action taking place on Tuesday. The overall Back Mountain Baseball major league championship will be decided on Thursday night at 7:45 at the W.W. Kubis Memorial Field between the American and National League playoff champions.

In first round playoff action, the Dodgers came back to beat the Giants, 11-9, while the Phillies blanked the Reds, 13-0, in the National League semi-finals. In the American League, the Rangers beat the Red Sox, 11-1, while the Tigers drubbed the A's 25-3.

The Dodgers, who trailed by as many as six runs, scored five runs in the sixth inning to post a come-from-behind win over the Giants. Steve Moyer led the Dodgers with a double and triple while Ben Brown also had two hits. Colin McHale and Matt Loftus each had a double for the winners. J.B. Bucha led the Giants with three hits, including a triple, while Tom Byron and Joel Whipple had two hits apiece. Pat Mulhern belted a double for the Giants.
