sylvania, Inc. is conducting a survey of customers who might be affected by a state law dealing with utility service to rental properties.

According to Michael J. Coyle, Manager, the law, Act 54, which went into effect last September, requires the owner of a residential building or mobile home park in which the units are not individually metered to notify all utilities of the ownership of the rental property and to be responsible for paying for the utility service received.

The owner is responsible for paying the water service even if there is a lease or agreement involved.

In the case of individually me-

General Waterworks of Penn- tered units, the owner is responsible unless the tenant has contractually agreed to pay the water service.

Act 54 also provides protection for tenants if a landlord fails to pay the water bill. The tenant can pay the landlord's water bill and deduct the amount from the rent to avoid a shutoff of utility service. The law prohibits the landlord from retaliating by raising the rent and provides other protection to tenants.

Landlords or owners of rental property and tenants are requested by General Waterworks of Pennsylvania, Inc. to complete and return the survey which will come with an upcoming water bill.


He previously served as a member of the Nesbitt Memorial Hospital medical executive committee and was past secretary/ treasurer of the hospital's medical staff.

Harveys Lake cleanup day July 9


Harveys Lake Borough's clean-up day will be held July 9 from 9-1 at the borough garage on West Point Avenue.
