The following is the short title of the ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CHAPTER 2, PART 1, SECTION 101, ETC. OF THE CODE OF AN ORDINANCE OF KINGSTON TOWNSHIP, LUZERNE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, RELATING TO NOISY ANIMALS AND ENACTING AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE DEFECTION OF ANIMALS UPON PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PROPERTY AND DESIGNATING SUCH DEFECTION AS BEING A NUISANCE, PROHIBITING NOISE DISTURBANCE OF ANIMALS AND DESIGNATING SUCH NOISE DISTURBANCE AS A NUISANCE, IMPOSING A DUTY UPON OWNERS OF ANIMALS TO DISPOSE OF ANIMAL FECES, EXEMPTING DOGS ACCOMPANYING BLIND OR HANDICAPPED PERSONS, AND FIXING A FINE FOR VIOLATION HEREOF, PROVIDING FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF, AND PROVIDING FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF.

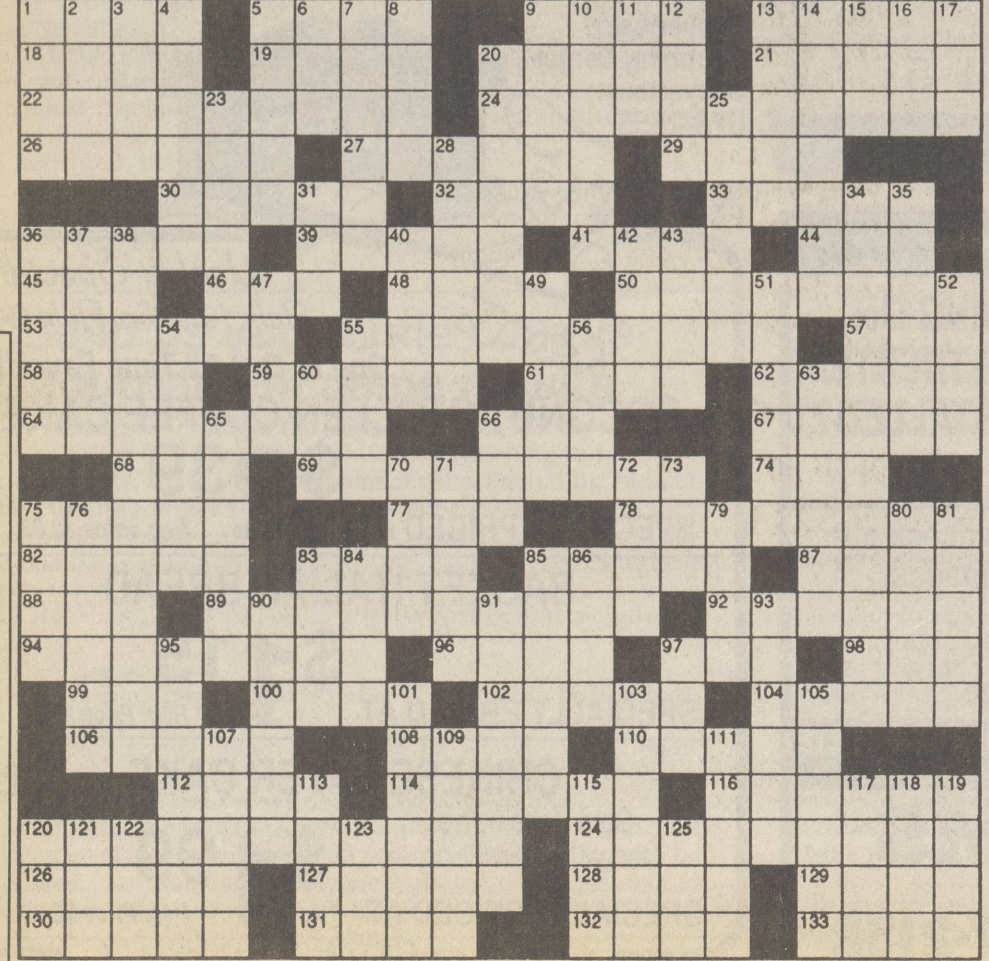
