## Paley earns full scholarship to PA Free Enterprise Week

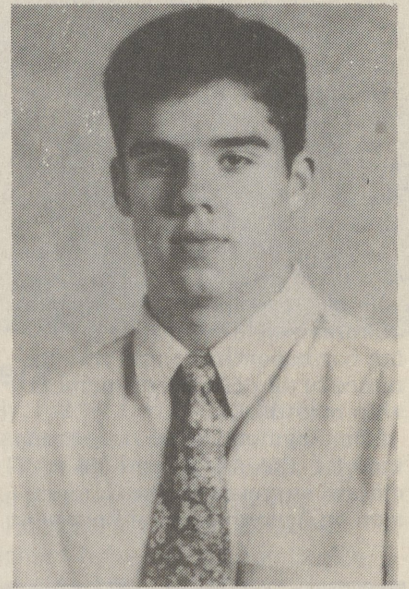

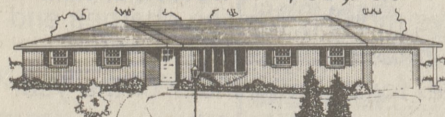

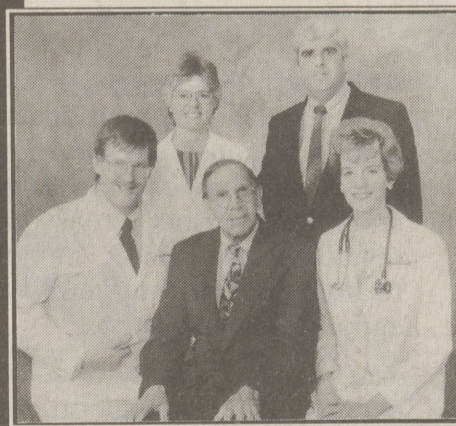
