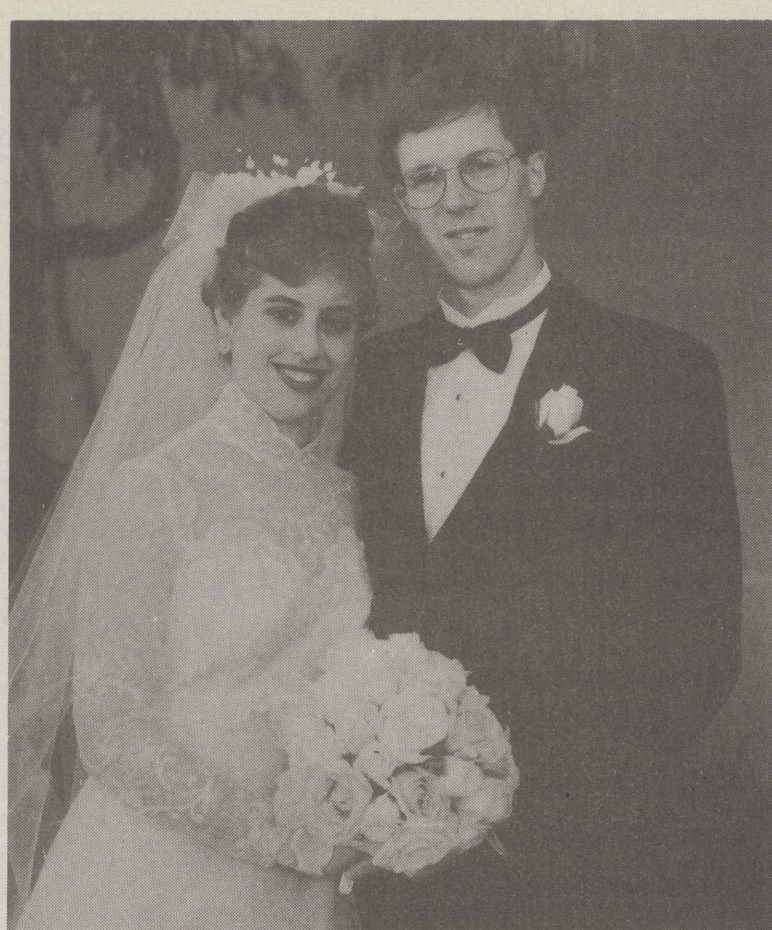
## Susann Slocum engaged to Michael Triponey
