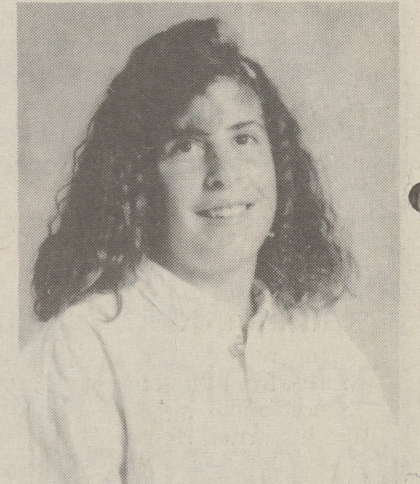
## Greger earns scholarship for Free Enterprise Week

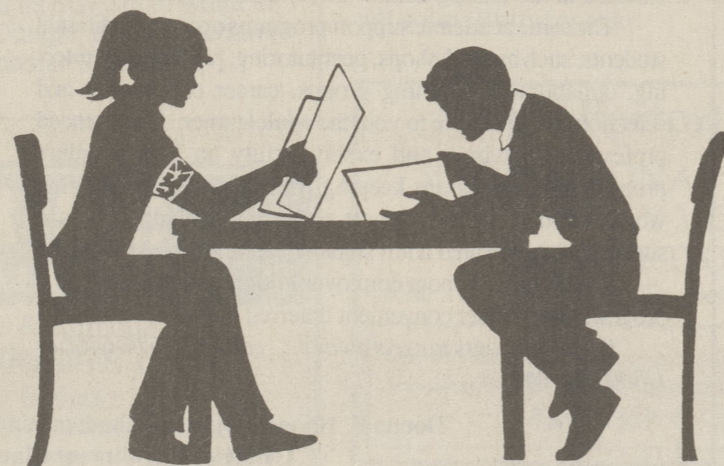
