Mellon Bank to display works of area artists

Sue Hand and Leigh Pawling, two area women who have devoted their lives to art, will present an exhibit of their most recent artworks at Sue Hand's Imagery, Dallas, from August 29 through September 3, with an opening reception August 27.

Included in the exhibit are many local landscapes which have been painted on location, floral and still life paintings and figure studies, completed this past spring and summer.

None of the artworks have been previously exhibited.

Hand is a nationally recognized artist who paints daily, teaches fine art drawing and painting to students of all ages in her private studio; writes a national quarterly newsletter for plein air painters and leads a teen artists' Bible study in addition to many other activities.

She is best known for her watercolors, alkyds and ink drawings. Her paintings are sold through several galleries in Maine and Hilton Head, South Carolina. Her plein air paintings, miniatures, and other works are included in collections around the world.

Hand is a member of more than a dozen state, national and international art organizations and is a founding member of the Cider Painters of America and the Pennsylvania En Plein Air Society.

Hand and her husband, Joseph, and daughter Heather Hand Madeira have operated their family art studio in Dallas for nearly 20 years.

Pawling, a fine arts graduate of Wittenberg University, resides in New York City and studies at the New York Art Students League with Peter Cox and Michael Burban.

She has lived and painted in Florence, Italy and is represented by Sue Hand's Imagery and by several galleries in the Cayman Islands. She is a signature member of the Pennsylvania Plein Air Society. She is the daughter of Shep and Corrine Pawling, Dallas.

An opening reception will be held August 27 from 7-9 p.m. at Sue Hand's Imagery, 35 Main Street, Dallas.
