Penn State facts, figures

Penn State's Wilkes-Barre campus has grown dramatically since it was established in 1916 to teach mining, engineering and mathematics to area young men.

Classes met in rented space in a downtown building until 1968, when it relocated to the old Conyngham estate in Lehman Township.

Penn State is Luzerne County's oldest institution of higher learning, offering both two-year associate degree programs and the first two years of a four-year degree program, in which students transfer to other Penn State campuses or other schools to complete their degrees.

Other highlights include:

- A four-year surveying degree program, one of two on the East Coast, began this year. Students will be able to complete all four years at the Wilkes-Barre campus.
- A four-year program combining electrical and mechanical engineering technology, to be offered at Wilkes-Barre and three other Penn State campuses, is also planned.
- The Wilkes-Barre campus is one of 17 in the Penn State system.
- Its \$4.4 million budget is allocated from the main campus at University Park.
- It has a 15/1 student/teacher ratio.
- 76 teachers and 84 support staff members work on campus.
- Full-time student enrollment is 731.
- Part-time student enrollment is 159.
- Tuition is \$193 per credit hour or \$2,404 per semester for 12-18 credit hours.
- Approximately 8,000 additional people are served through the campus's continuing education program, seminars and mini-courses offered during the year.

Crash sends three to hospital

Dallas Township police are investigating a two-car accident on Lower Demunds Road at the intersection with Campground Hill and Edinger Hill shortly after 8 p.m. August 24.

Police said that a 1988 Acura operated by David Kasmak, 29, of Dallas, was traveling north on Lower Demunds Road when it struck the right side of a 1990 Ford Tempo operated by Carrie Kinney, 28, of Tunkhannock, which pulled across Lower Demunds Road from Campground Hill and in front of the Kasmak vehicle.

Kinney, Kasmak and his passenger, Jason Miller, 20, of Swoyersville, were taken to the Geisinger Wyoming Valley Medical Center by ambulances from Dallas and Kunkle, where they were treated and released, according to an emergency room spokesperson.

Police said that there was no evidence of alcohol being involved in the accident. Everyone was wearing seatbelts, police said.

Police were assisted at the scene by Medic-I and the Pennsylvania State Police Crime Lab.

Patrolman Robert Jolley is the investigating officer.
