Abram Nesbitt III makes record donation to PSU

The Wilkes-Barre Campus of Penn State has received a gift of more than one million dollars from the Abram Nesbitt III family of Lake Catalpa Tree Farm, Dallas, to create a future endowment fund to support the campus' surveying engineering program, the biomedical equipment technology degree program and the campus library.

This gift is the largest single gift ever received by Penn State Wilkes-Barre. As support for the library, surveying and biomedical equipment technology programs, it may be used for such purposes as research, faculty and student scholarly travel, equipment, student scholarships and lecture-ships.

Nesbitt, a member of one of the region's most prominent families, has been on the Advisory Board Penn State Wilkes-Barre for almost 30 years. He and his wife, Caroline, have supported the campus generously in the past providing a laboratory in 1988 for the Center of Technology building.

The Nesbitts' daughter, Geraldine Nesbitt, has attended Penn State Wilkes-Barre, and her daughter, Sarah, participates in the youth programs.

Nesbitt has been president of the board of Nesbitt Memorial Hospital and also served on the board of First Eastern Bank. He is owner/manager of Lake Catalpa Tree Farm.

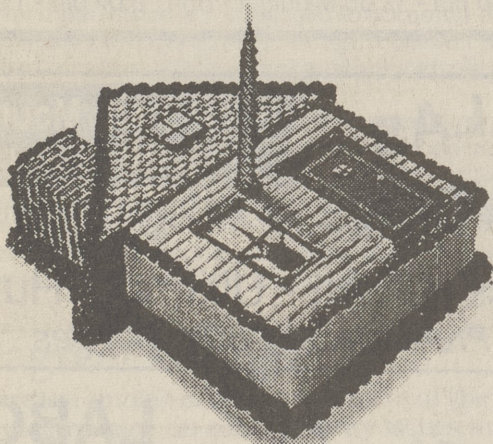
