

WVIA to air program on outcome-based education

This September marks the return to school, and one-third of Pennsylvania's school districts will begin implementing a new approach to the teaching and learning process called "outcome-based" education.

All districts must adopt (OBE) over the next three years. While it has been billed as the most significant reform in education policy in decades, many parents and taxpayers are still uncertain what its human or monetary cost will be.

On August 31, at 8 p.m. WVIA's live public affairs show **Both Sides Now** will examine the impact on

area children of this significant but often poorly understood set of changes.

A number of school districts in Northeastern Pennsylvania have already spent a year preparing for the transition to OBE. To its proponents, it represents a much needed revision of a curriculum that has been in place for some 30 years.

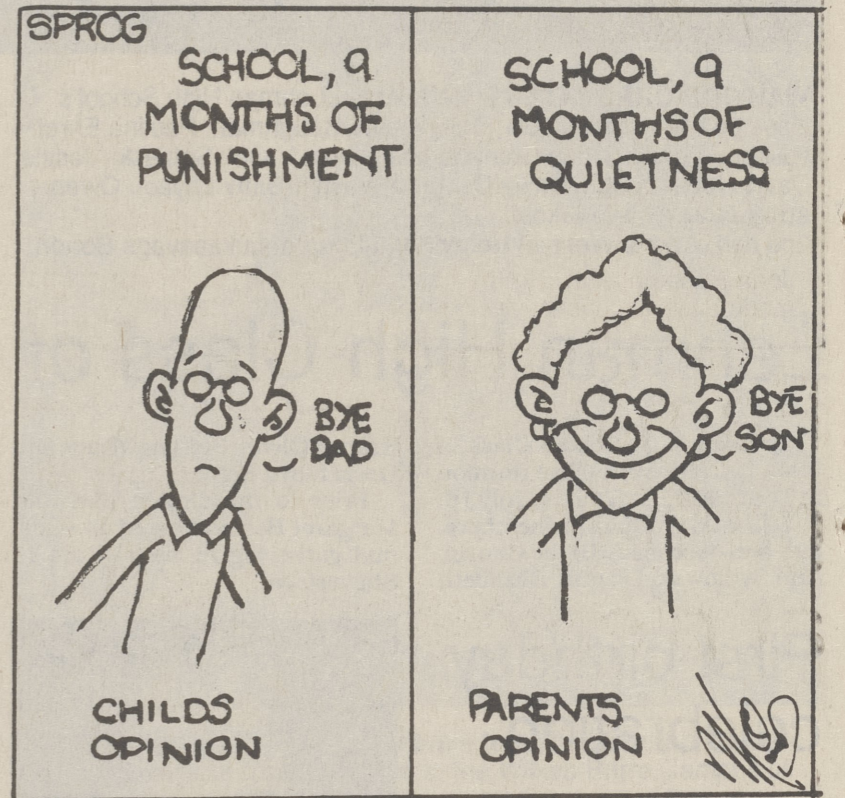

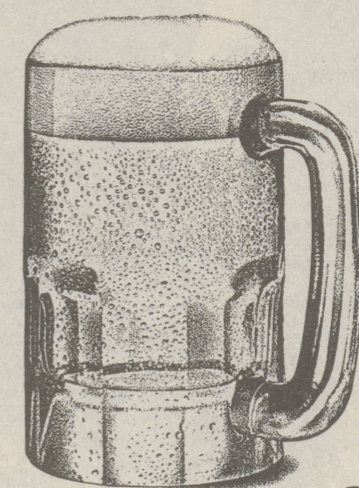
