## Win-loss record doesn't worry coach

A year ago the Lake-Lehman Black Knights' golf team got off to a slow start, posting a lackluster 2-3 record after five matches. But the Knights rebounded to win their final nine matches of the season and capture the school's first-ever Wyoming Valley Conference Division II title.

If the 1994 team is to repeat as champions, they'll have to overcome adversity.

Nikki Sennett, a favorite to capture the PIAA state girls' championship this season, transferred to Bishop O'Reilly for her senior year, leaving a huge void on the Black Knights' roster. Other than acknowledging that Sennett had indeed switched schools, Lehman head coach Mike Sharok didn't comment further on the situation.

But the Lehman coach has produced consistent winners during his 14 seasons with the Lake-Lehman program, and despite Sennett's departure, there's no reason to think otherwise for this season.

"We have three strong lettermen returning," said Sharok of seniors Ray Bartosh, Mark Andrusis and junior Jeff Farley. "These guys have been around a few years and they have some good experience. We're going to have to rebuild a little bit and go on from there."

ued the veteran head coach. "But they're capable of doing it and that's the key. They've been working hard all summer."

In addition to the three returnees, Sharok will also be counting on the services of a handful of promising first-year players; seniors Tom C. Brown, Tom G. Brown (no relation) and Steve Rogers; and sophomores Joe Halowich and Bill Humphreys.

The Black Knights will be playing in a new format in the WVC, where each team will play the other 16 teams in the conference once, instead of the former eight-team divisional format.

Although he's won far more games than he's lost as head coach, including a 31-11 record over the past three seasons, Sharok had placed little emphasis on wins and losses. This year will be no different.

"I've always said that wins and losses are fine but the most important thing is that these kids learn the game of golf," said the Black Knight coach, who has a refreshing attitude in today's "winner-take-all" society. "Golf is a very tough game, a life-long game you can play for many years. We've done real well as far as wins and losses are concerned, but I don't worry about that stuff. I just want to see the kids grow, learn the game and get better every time they play."

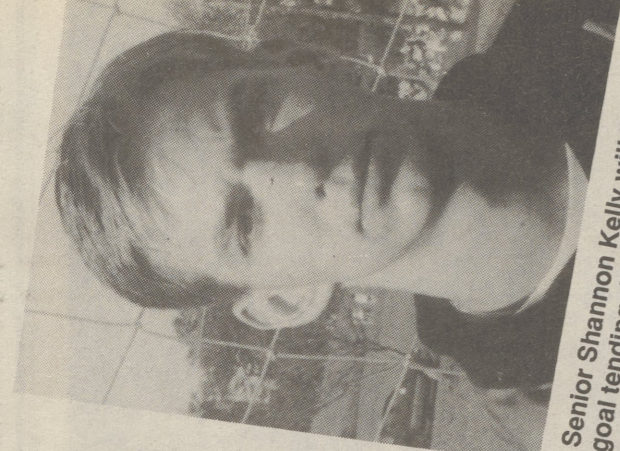
