Coach Nark likes new schedule format

For the Lake-Lehman High School cross-country team, the 1994 season is a case of quality, not quantity.

Just six runners make up the roster for the Black Knights this season. But they're talented athletes and veteran head coach Ed Narkiewicz remains optimistic.

"That's it, that's our entire roster," said Narkiewicz, after reading off the six names. "So far, we've been looking pretty good. They're enthusiastic at practices and they're willing to put in the time it takes to train to become better. I really don't know how we'll do in the conference until we get started. But we're looking forward to the season."

As a sophomore last season, Chris Long finished in the top 10 in the District 2 Class AA championship and qualified for the state meet at Lehigh University. Narkiewicz is hoping that experience helps Long become one of the best runners in the Wyoming Valley Conference this season.

"I think it was invaluable experience, especially for a sophomore," said the Lehman coach, who enters his 18th year as head runner. "He's really become a good runner. We're going to need him this season."

Joining Long as returning starters are juniors Mike Phillips and Chris Rishko. Combined with Long, the pair gives the Black Knights a solid trio of performers - which can go a long way in winning league meets.

"We had a good team last year and we had some very good play-



ers. But to be honest, I really don't want to lose three games in the regular season again," said Rogers, whose team picked up their fourth loss in the D-2 final against the Tigers. 


