Earns degree from Penn State

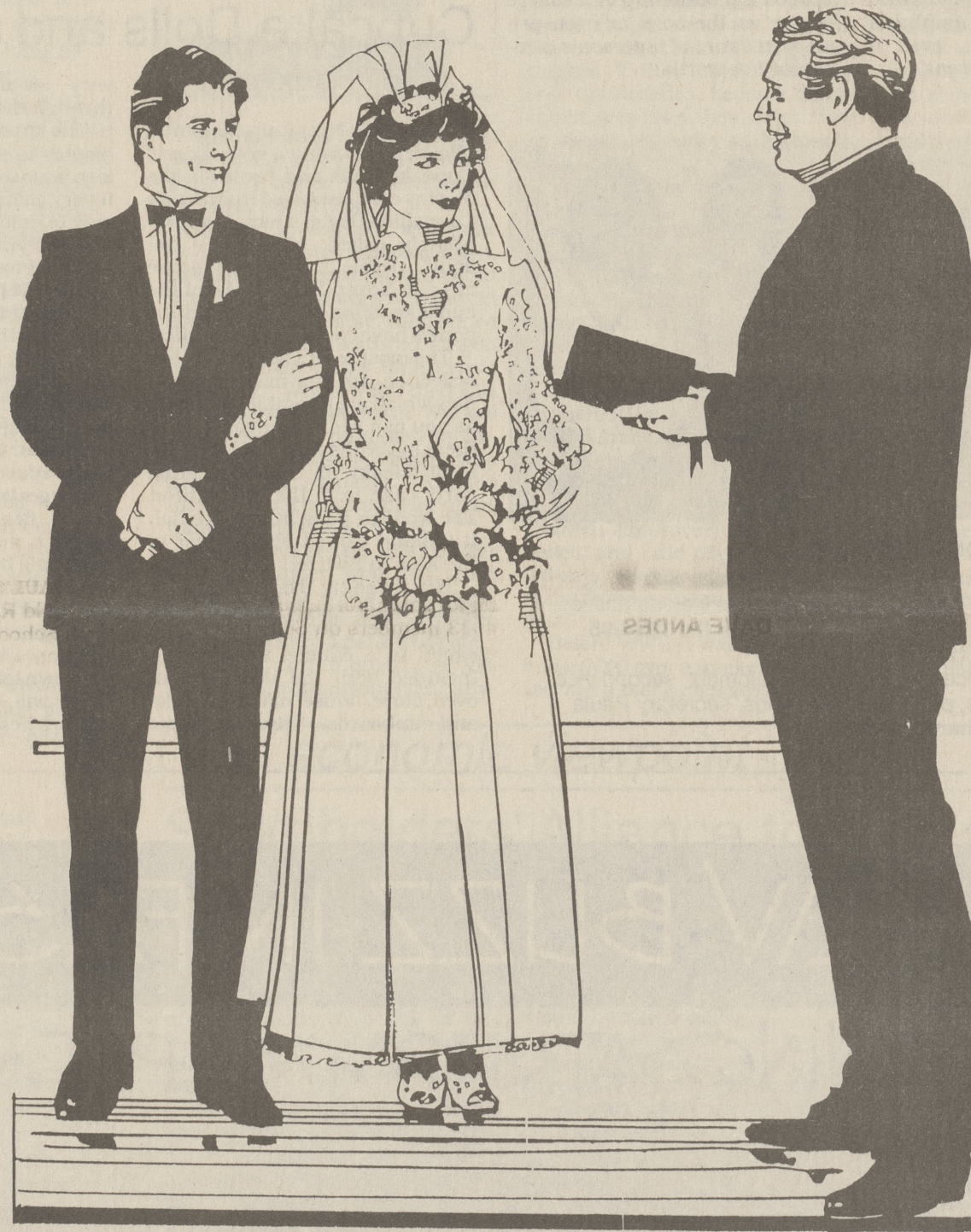
Martin Reynolds recently graduated from the School of Business Administration at Penn State University, Capital Campus.
