Banjo master Tony Trischka opens Chicory House season

"A celebration of the banjo from its roots to its branches" will be the theme of a concert by Tony Trischka, one of the instrument's foremost virtuosos and innovators at the Chicory House in Wilkes-Barre, September 9 at 8 p.m.

Tony Trischka's concert opens the sixth season at the nonprofit, volunteer-operated Chicory House, Northeastern Pennsylvania's only venue dedicated to presenting folk music and dance. The Chicory House holds its coffeehouse concerts in the Community Room of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, South Franklin Street across from Boscov's in downtown Wilkes-Barre.

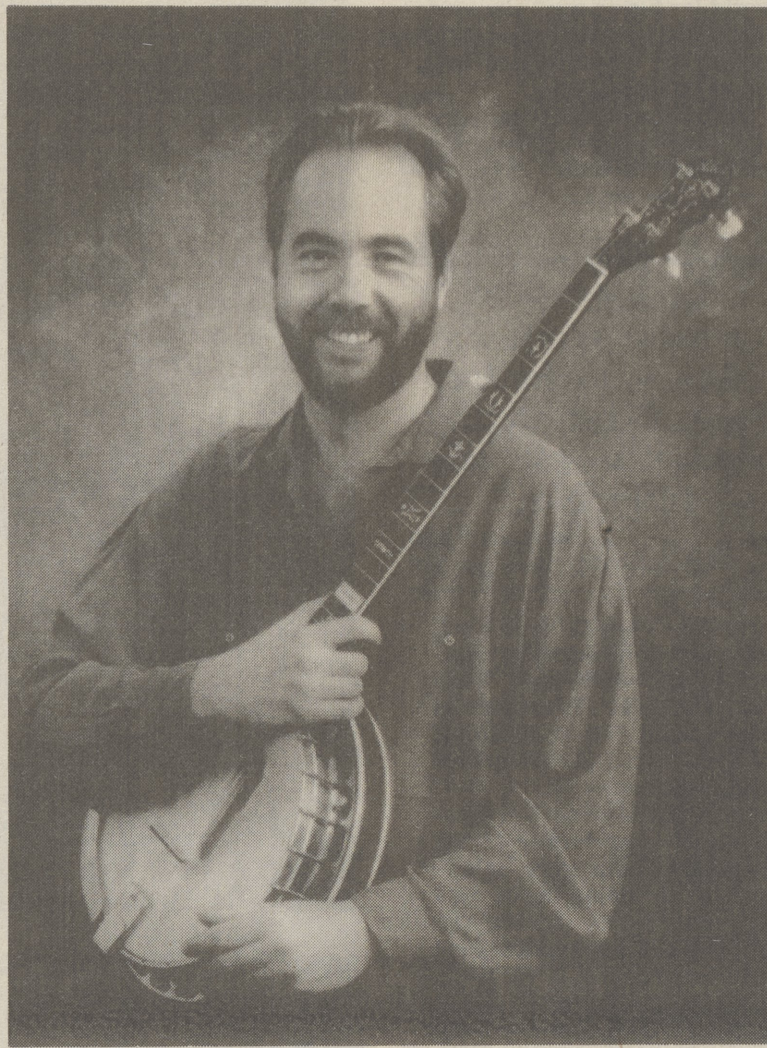
Doors will open for the concert at 7:30 p.m.

Trischka will explore the banjo's 200 year history, from its African roots through early African America, pre-Civil War minstrels, the "refined" turn-of-the-century ragtime and light classical styles, and then from old-time Appalachian music into bluegrass.

Admission to Trischka's Chicory House concert will be \$7 at the door.

There are no advance sales or reserved seats; table and other seating will be on a first-come, first-served basis. Desserts and beverages will be available for purchase.

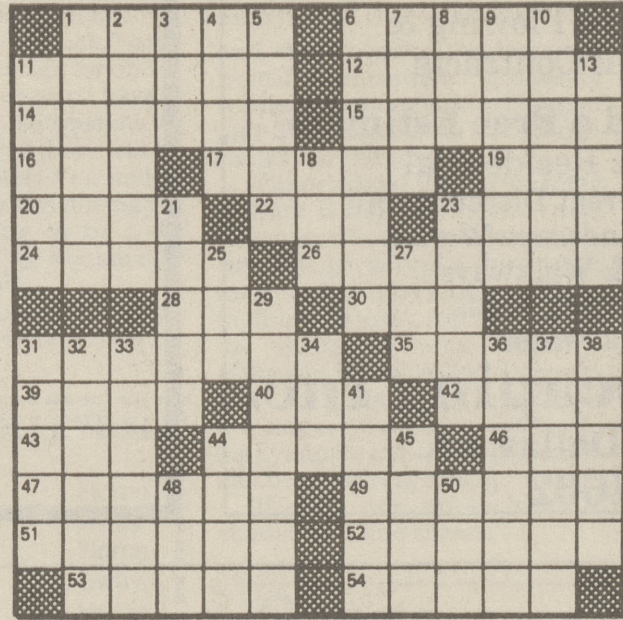

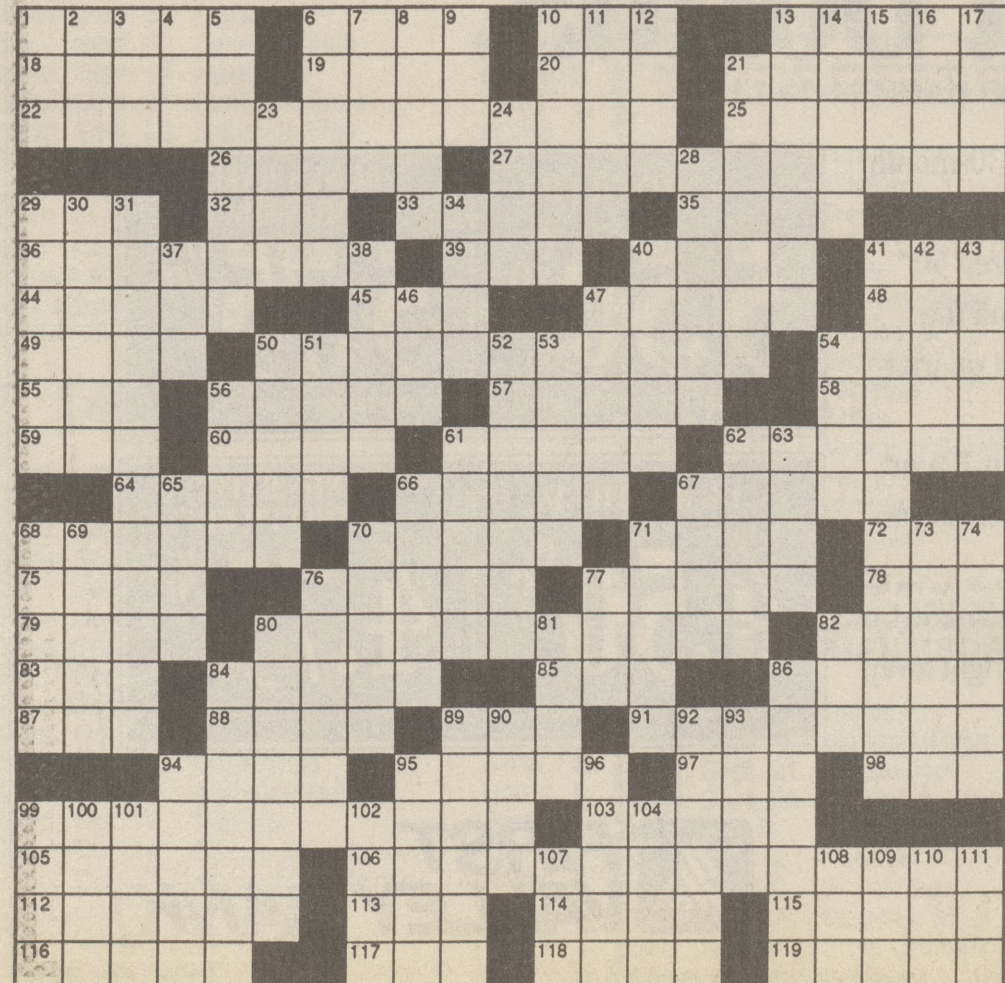

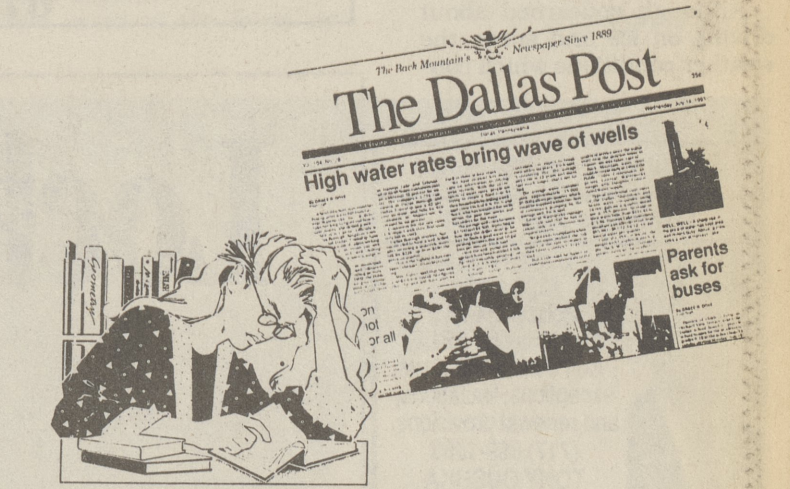
