The Baltimore Consort was founded in 1980 to perform the repertory for Elizabethan consort, a specific instrumentation of treble viol, flute, lute, cittern, bandora and bass viol.

The group has concentrated on British, French and Italian music of the 16th and 17th centuries.

The Baltimore Consort has released several compact discs on Dorian Recordings, including *On the Banks of the Helicon* (Early Music of Scotland), *Watkins Ale* (Music of the English Renaissance) and *La Rocque 'n' Roll* (Popular Music of Renaissance France). They have also toured extensively in the USA and Europe.

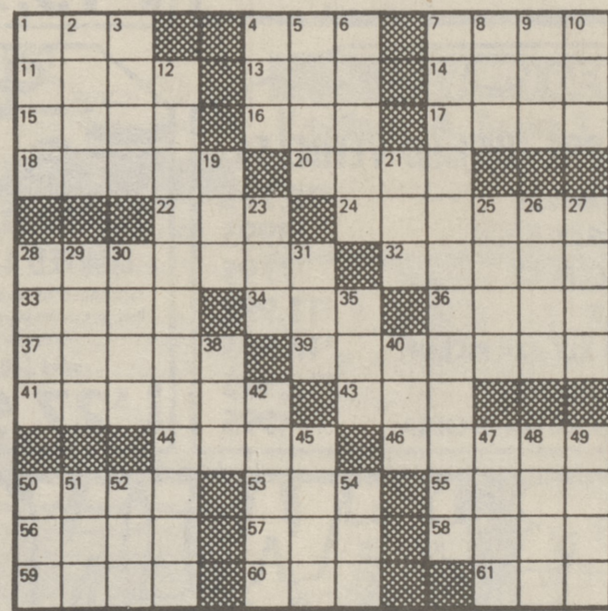

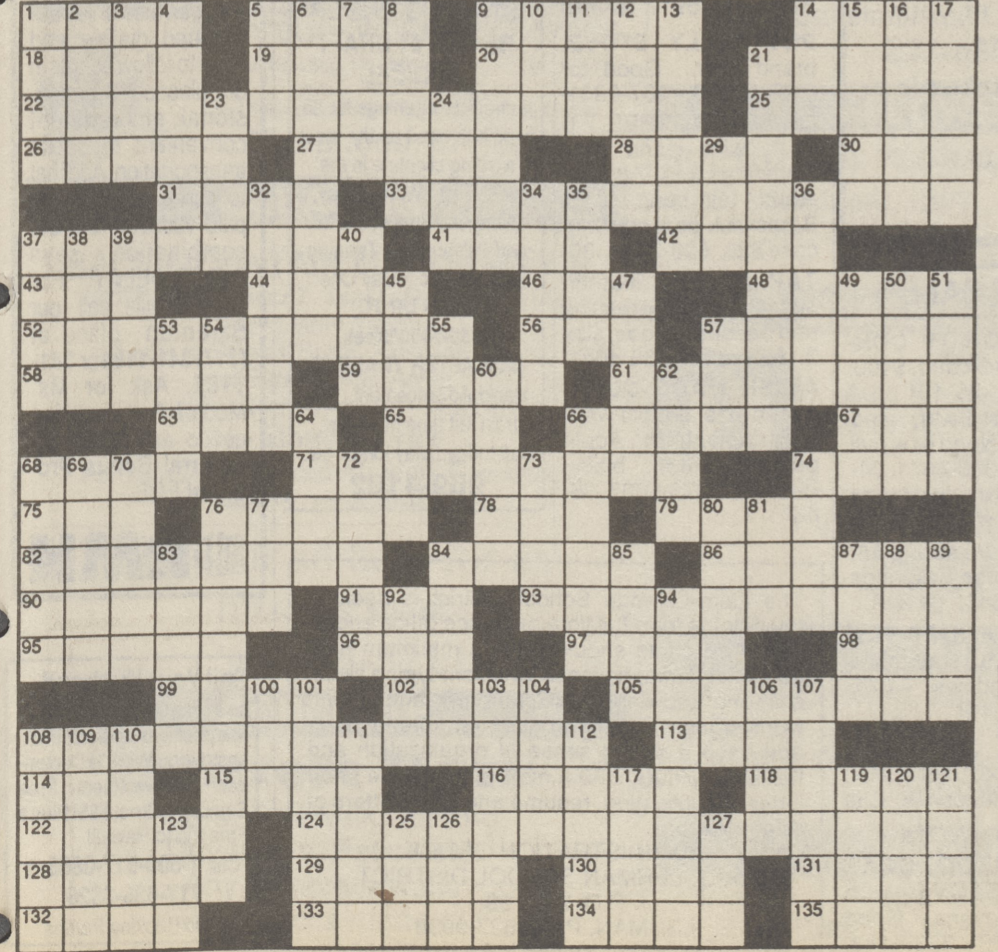

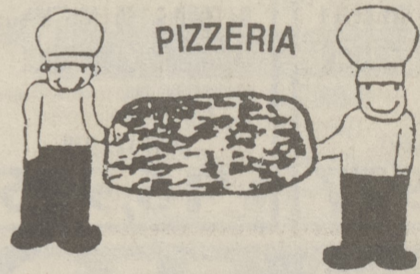
