The popular and successful Adult Literacy Program has started its 11th consecutive year of instruction and high school equivalency diploma (GED) testing.

Administered jointly by the Luzerne County Human Resources Development Department and the Luzerne County Intermediate Unit 18, classes are conducted weekdays from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

The program provides school dropouts who meet the economic

guidelines with the opportunity to earn a GED certificate issued by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. There is no charge for eligible students.

Students may start and finish when they have completed their programs and are ready for testing. Many have done this in two weeks, working up to 20 hours per week.

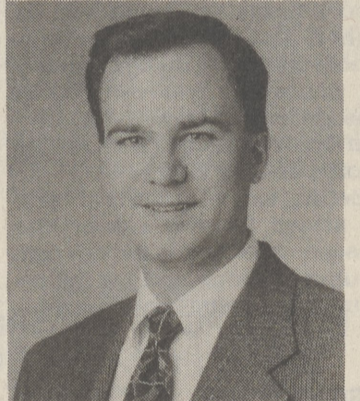

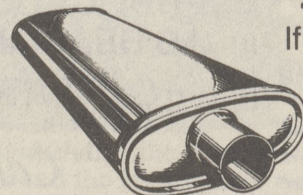
