New King's College Life Science building dedicated to Parentes

King's College's new \$6.4 million Charles E. and Mary Parente Life Sciences Center was dedicated September 16, with a ceremony including a keynote address by Nobel Laureate James E. Muller, MD, and the unveiling of a commemorative plaque honoring Back Mountain residents Charles E. Parente '62 and his wife, Mary.

Housing King's biology and psychology departments, the Life Sciences Center is home to the molecular biology program and a new program in bio-psychology.

The three-story structure includes computer facilities, biology labs, faculty research labs, a cell culture lab, environmental growth chambers, the electromicroscopy suite, the radioisotope lab, the bioprocessing lab, a rooftop greenhouse and two specialty classrooms in the psychology department.

Following the blessing by King's president Rev. James Lackenmier, CSC, Donald Sanderson of Quad Three Group and Andrew Sordoni, III, of Sordoni Construction Company presented the building key to board of directors chairman Charles E. Parente.

Psychology department chairperson Dr. Charles Brooks unveiled the plaque.
