Erik Santos of Swyersville was recently awarded the prestigious Charles Ives Scholarship for young composers at the annual ceremony of the American Academy of Arts and Letters in New York City.

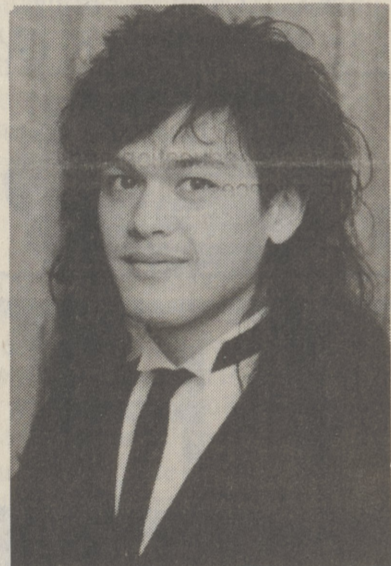
Santos, 26, lives with his wife, Sharon Marie, in Ann Arbor, Michigan, where he is completing a doctorate of musical arts at the University of Michigan.

He has won several prizes for his solo and orchestral compositions, most notably the BMI Young Composer Award in 1990.

Since then, he has received a number of commissions for compositions.

Santos is also a concert pianist and vocalist, specializing in the performance of 20th century works and teaches private lessons in composition, theory and piano.

He is the son of Prof. Rosendo and Rev. Harriet Santos, and has
