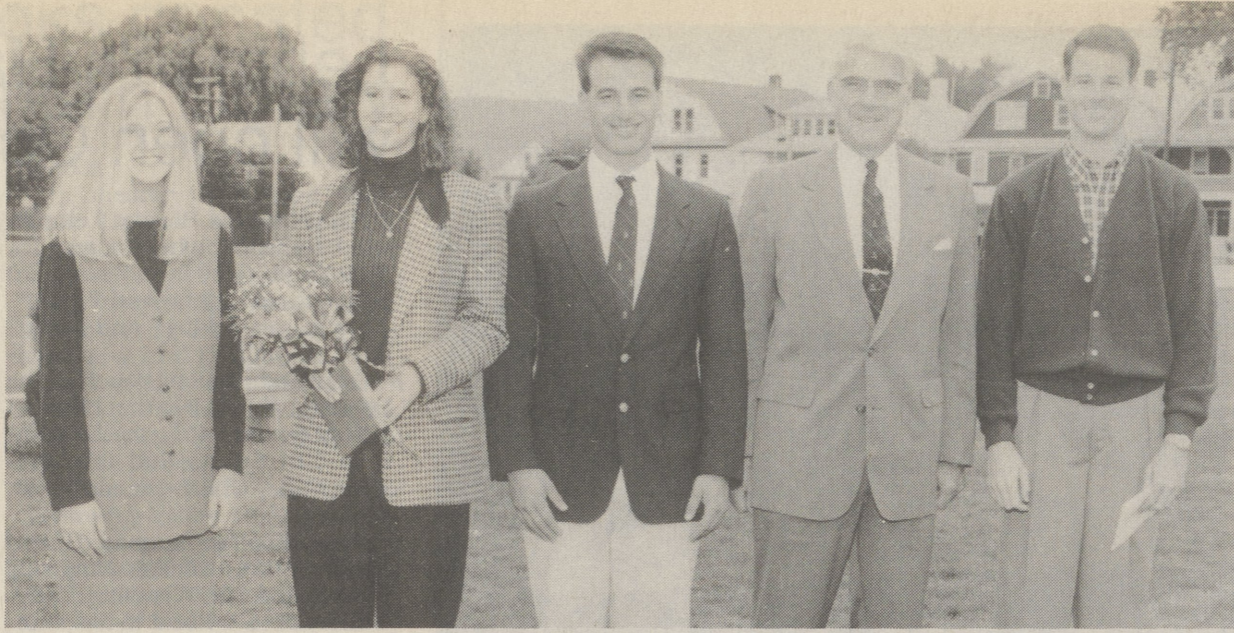
She was escorted by John Suardini of Bethlehem.

He writes and lectures throughout the country on bettering the educational system for our children.

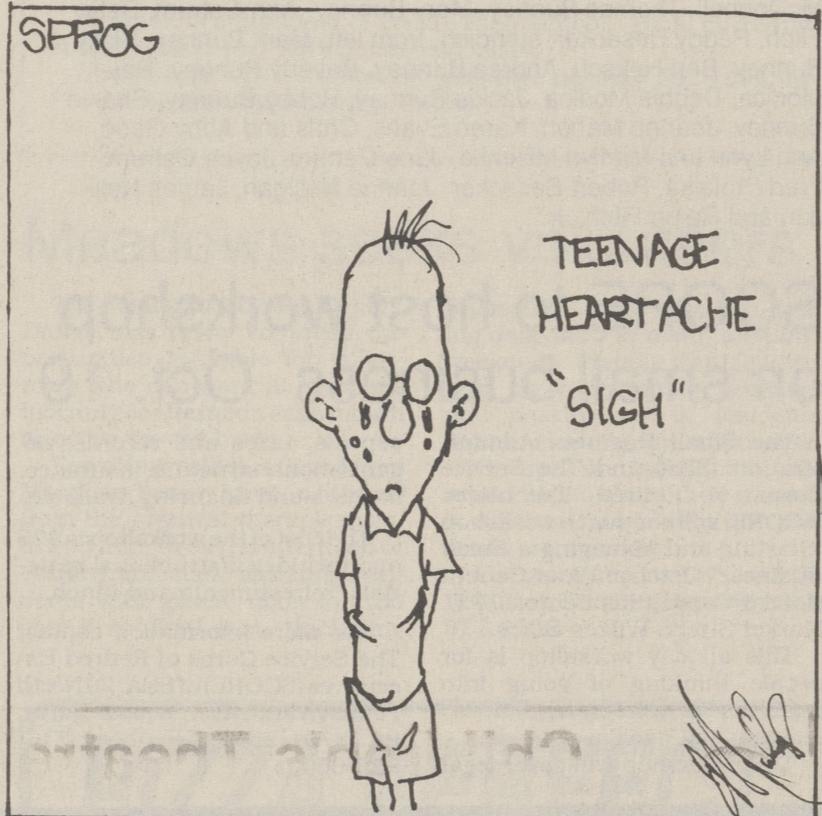

Burke earns degree

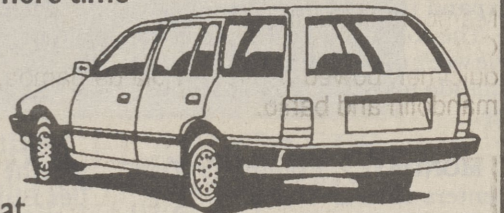
Dallas resident Kerry Burke recently graduated from Philadelphia College of Textile and Science, Philadelphia, with a Bachelor of Arts in textile design.
