Following a honeymoon cruise to the Caribbean, the couple resides in Maryland.

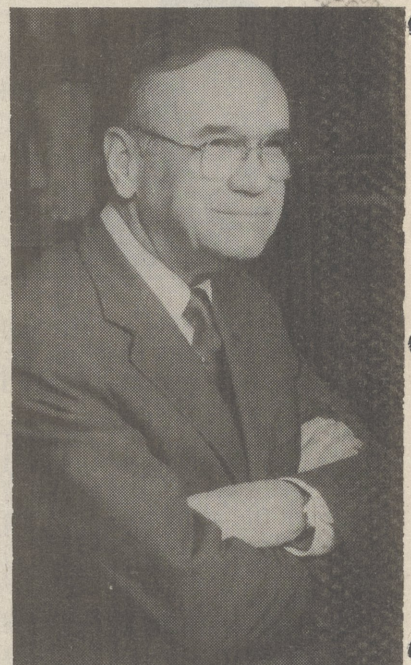
## Stettler will receive Sem's highest service award

Wyoming Seminary's highest honor - the Distinguished Service Award - will be presented at a special ceremony, November 4 to Seminary president emeritus Dr. Wallace F. Stettler of Dallas.

Liva Weil Baker, Morgan R. "Dick" Jones and Stanley Nabi will also receive the award that day.

Dr. Stettler is well-known to the Wyoming Valley, having served as president of Wyoming Seminary from 1967 to 1990.

A native of Philadelphia, he holds a bachelor's degree from Dickinson College, a master's degree from Drew Theological Seminary and honorary doctoral degrees from King's College, College Misericordia and Wilkes University.

Before assuming the Seminary presidency, Stettler had a distinguished career in the Methodist ministry.

During his 23 year tenure at Seminary, he guided the school's recovery from the 1972 Agnes flood, the curriculum and facilities were improved and expanded, and faculty development was made a major priority.

Stettler has also been a significant community leader, serving on the boards of Leadership Wilkes-Barre, Nesbitt Memorial Hospital, the Northeastern Pennsylvania Philharmonic and the United Way of Wyoming Valley.

All area women veterans are invited. There will be a Health Fair and refreshments will be served.



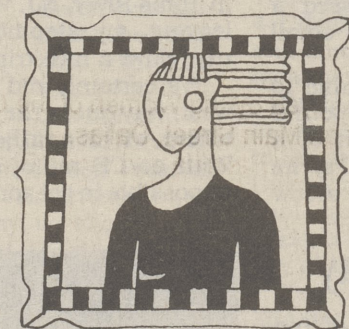
